



He was also a prominent member of the Chamber of Commerce and International Rotary Club of Alameda, and a bonded member of Florist Telegraph Delivery Association.

Harry was also interested in education and served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Japanese school at the Buddhist Temple of Alameda.

If Harry is remembered at all today, it's as one of the Alameda Taiiku Kai (ATK) baseball team managers. He also organized all-star baseball teams that traveled around California and Japan. Some of the teams that competed in Japan included Caucasian players which starred several future mayors of Alameda.

Harry's fortunes turned with the advent of World War II. He lost the floral business and evacuated to Gila River in Arizona. When he was released, he restarted his life in Selma, CA, a small farmtown just south of Fresno.

He never returned to Alameda...and that's why he isn't well remembered anymore.

He died in Fresno on February 5, 1955.
