

Misao Murotani was living in Barrack 6G-8B and had also been in Tule Lake. Perhaps Frances knew her from there. Annabel and Frances entered Amache from Tule Lake on the same day (Sept 15, 1943). Annabel departed Amache on May 21, so this photo, taken in May, was made before that date.

**Yasuyo "Frances" Ikeda's** journey into incarceration was a circuitous one. Born in Alameda, CA, her family was in Sacramento when they were sent directly to Tule Lake on June 6, 1942, completely avoiding the Assembly Centers (Direct Evacuation). Then on September 15, 1942 they entered Amache/Granada. A month later, Frances took a job in Ogden, Utah and left camp on October 25.

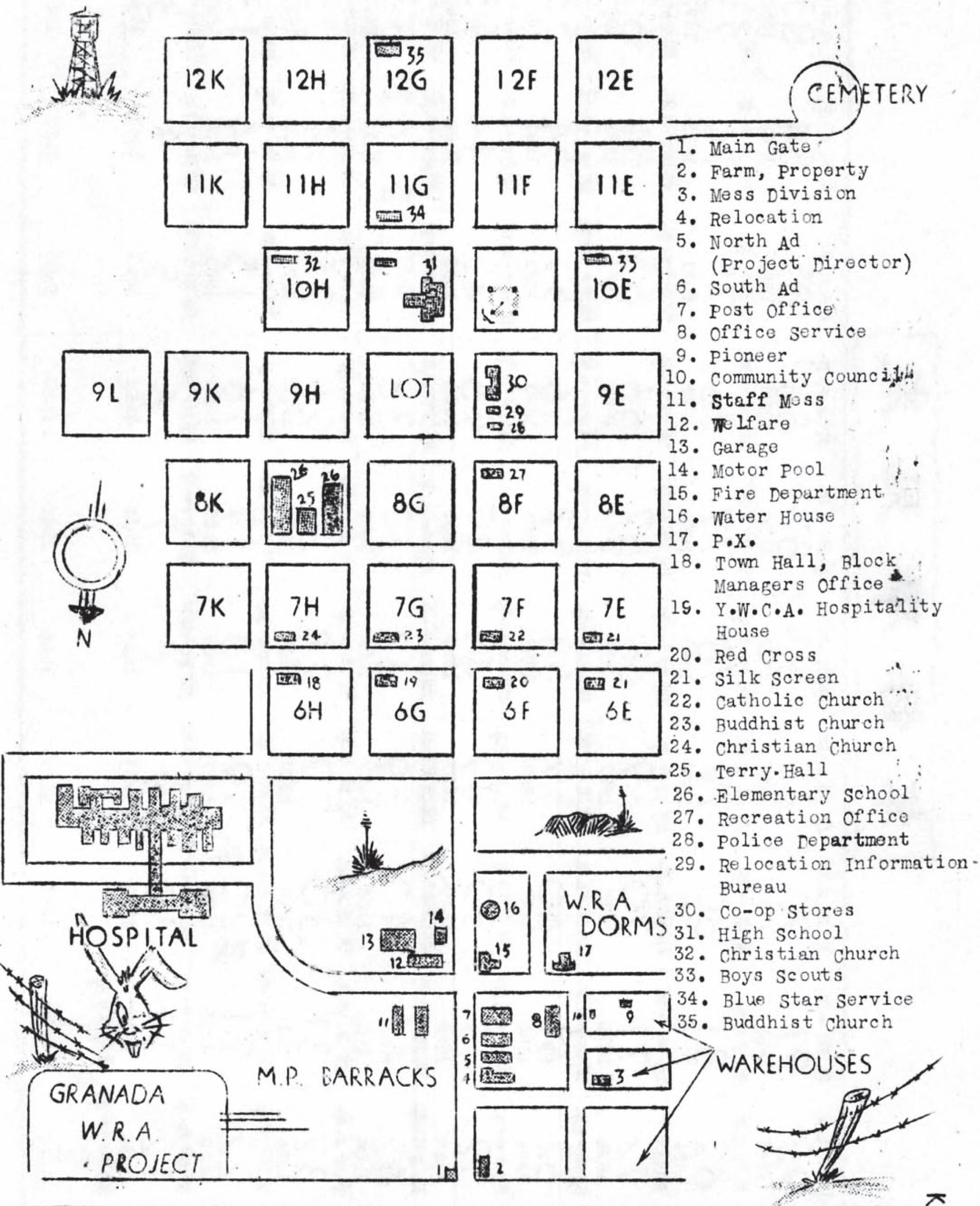
