

THIRD AND FINAL REPORT OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE

REDRESS FOR A LONGSTANDING WRONG

The relocation, dispossession and incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II remains a glaring violation of constitutional rights and a stain upon the honor of the United States.

The Newspaper Guild International Executive Board supports efforts of the Japanese American Citizens League's National Committee for Redress to obtain speedy and thorough investigations by the Commission on Wartime Relocation and Internment of Civilians, a commission established by Congress in 1980.

We believe that until this particular episode of American history is set right, it serves as a dangerous precedent of law for all citizens of this nation.
