
Dear Mr. Klein:

Thank you for your letter. As you probably know, S. 1647 has been assigned to the Governmental Affairs Committee and must undergo committee review before it can be considered by the full Senate.

I agree that the internment of Japanese Americans during World War II was abhorrent and contrary to American principles. I believe there is general consensus that the policy was wrong and should never be repeated.

I will listen to the arguments in favor of the establishment of such a commission and will have your own views in mind when the legislation is considered in the full Senate. I am glad that you took the time to write.
