## Dear Mr. Schmidt:

Upon receipt of your communication of April 14, 1944, I dispatched a communication to Mr . Greaves requesting a mobile unit and personnel be sent to Tule Lake Center for the purpose of determining if the radiotelegraph signals reported, originated from a transmitter in that vicinity.

Reference is made to the penultimate paragraph of your communication regarding security of correspondence. I would like to point out that the Radio Intelligence Division, since its inception in 1940, has adopted the military procedure in handling communications and correspondence. It has received an "Excellent" rating in this respect as a result of a survey made by the Joint Chief's of Staff. However, far be it from me to criticize another agency but I would like to point out that your communication, addressed to me, was received in a single envelop and marked on the front "SACRET AND CONFIDENTIAL". This, of course, is a violation of the outstanding instructions on this subject to Federal Agencies as released by the Office of War Information. I am returning the envelop referred to.

Please be assured of our continued cooperation.

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It is pointed out that the Admininstration is not conoorned with the subject of attendance or non-attondance either in the Center School or in the Japanese language schools. polioy does not require attendance at either type of school. The Administration, hovever, is concemed about the activities of the Japanese language school. proponents who seek to have the language school take procedence over authorized prograns of the projeat, such as the Center School and Community Activities and who use terroristio mothods to axercise control ovar othar rosidents, both parents and ohildren, to conform willynilly to thoir wishes. The activities and attitudes are dofinitely disruptive of specific phases of project operation, inciuding Education, Commity Activities, and Evacuee Lousing.

For several wooks the Administration has been working with a group a leaders who represent that they have been selected by the respertive wards to serve as a Japanese Language School Board of Fdueation. The intention was to recognize this group as the body seleoted by the residents to give leadership and supervision to language school activities; to devise some sort of organization under which the language sohool would operate; to select teachers and be responsible lor their acts; to provide curxiculum and superintend instruction; to provide for the Center Superintendent of Sohools, information conoerning the number of schools, their looations, their prinaipals and teaohers, and enrollment and attendanoe reports; and to provide $21 a i s o n$ with the Administration whereby comon problams could be solved. After a serles of conferences between representatives of the "School Board" and Mr. Gunderson, principal of the High School, a momorandum (See Exhibit (id) was issued by the Project Director, dated March 30,1944 , which was purportedly and intentionally an operating agreoment between the Administration and the Japanese Language School Board. It provided for recognition by the Administration of the School Board, and oalled for the School Board to assume aertain jurisdiction and rösponsibilities.

After a time it devoloped that the School Boord was ofther unable or unvilling to assume the jurisdiction and responsibilities it was conterplated they should assume, to the extent that they were not even able to control unofficial, unauthorized, erroneous and miso interproted announcements whioh were disseminated through the schools and through the blocks. This resuitod in the submission by Mr. Hariness, Superintendent of Schools, of the draft of an officiai announcement to be dsseminatod for the purpose of correcting what appeared to be deliborate misinformation. (See Exhibit ${ }^{\prime \prime}$.

The Inerfoctiveness of the Japanese Language School Board of Rducation in bringing about a responsible organization of the language school program led to the determination of the Administration to withdrav recognition which evidently had beon misplaced. This ineffectiveness and the accompanying rise of Iriction in Blook $/ 54$ were derinitely 1 inked together. The School Board adratted that they had no control over the school activities of Ward 6 in which Blook \#54 is 2ocated.
