Dear Sir:

Upon receiving Shavemaster Number 679333, repaired by you and billed in the amount of \$5.40, as of 4-17-44, I wish to report that the razor, while functioning as far as shaving is concerned, is 0. K. However, the first time the razor was used, it manifested a habit of turning off and on at intermittent will.

As it is more or less necessary for me to retain this razor for shaving comfort, which I would not have if I sent it to you again for re-repair, I am merely advising you of the situation in the event that it sopps functioning completely.

This will serve as a notice that it failed to function properly when I first received it. Also it may be possible that I might be in the East Bay when I will be able to bring it in personally. Also it is quite possible that you may be able to advise me of some minor mechanical adjustment which I might make as a layman and thus overcome the difficulty.
