Dear Sir:

Will you please release our father, so that our mother's health and mind may be restored again to normal.

Mother has been ill since our stay in Heart Mountain last year. She was improving until Jan 31, when our father was unexpected interned in the Army Stockade.

During our stay in Heart Mountain, mother was on the verge of death twice and thus confined in the hospital. Records will

prove this and also that it was necessary that she travel by train to this camp, this she did. Dr Ito of Heart Mountain specifically stated that her illness was a woman's change of life and her case a critical one. He also stated that she could be cured by rest, peace of mind, kindness and loving care, if not it could be the cause of her death.

Since the day father was taken, she has been restless and has been torturing her mind by

worrying. Her state of mind is more and more becoming affected, especially her health and illness is becoming worse. Despite the fact she is up and around once in a while, she has had already, twice this month the same symptoms as that when she was on the verge of death but not as bad.

We fear that if this continues without the presence of our father she will be no more in our lives physically or off mentally
