"Mr. Bingo (Block 74) was arrested on February 1st, but I can't figure out why he was arrested.

"If he was arrested because of he is agitator and for status quo, then I think you made mistake.

"There are three agitators, their name are Akashi, Kajikawa, and Kurihara in this block.

"It is big mistake to leave these people and arrest Mr. Bingo because he is innocent, and I request you give good consideration to him.

"Three persons forced other block residents to vote for status quo when the voting was held on January 11th, and they are still having the idea that being for status quo is their duty to be patriotic Japanese.

"I am sure that Mr. 'Bingo' is really innocent, and I ask you to give special consideration to him."
