To my opinion, the family table has many advantages, both toward the individual and his or her family. The method we're following at the present has little or hardly any advantage in it. For example, the latter one won't allow an individual to eat enough, not unless that individual is not bashful. By this I mean, as soon as he enters the mess hall, he sits on an assigned table and eat without hesitation conversing with those across him. This particular person gets along with people; however when it's in a case of a shy, bashful girl and she is assigned to sit among older folks and those of her opposite sex, surely! she will only eat a little, look up only occasionally, and even look up slowly to see if anybody had been watching her when the food slipped off from her fork. I know, because I had this experience many a time when I find that the family had already gone to eat.

The sooner the family table is organized, the sooner we can get rid of the "broken family" idea. Great many of the parents of our block is complaining and giving lectures to their sons and daughters about staying home more often because a great percentage of them hardly do except to retire for the day or except when they want something to take with them.

In my opinion, if the family table is organized I should think the family would contact in group to go to the mess and feel free to eat. We can enjoy the family comradeship again as we did before back home.

I consulted my mother about doing something about the whole thing. At the present, we have a small space in the corner as a study room and we promised one another

to ask either my kid brother or me whether they may allow any unnecessary noises. In other words, we're the boss for the first time!

I know it is very difficult for many of the students to study at home. The only thing I could think at the present is to make use of the study periods we have at school, by studying the most we can during that time.
