police, encamped near the center, at once were moved in. Soldiers patrolled the streets and quiet prevailed for several hours. But the crowd formed again late in the night, ultimately forcing soldiers to use tear gas and gunfire to quell the new uprising.

Trouble has been brewing for some time between this faction and the loyal Japanese who, Merritt declared, are not only in the majority but have cooperated fully in efforts to control the pro-Axis group.

"This started out to be a celebration of the Pearl Harbor anniversary, sponsored by pro-Axis Japanese," Merritt declared. "Loyal Japanese tried

to stop it, but failed.

CRISIS FOR CAMP

"The rioting brought a crisis that made necessary the calling out of military police and the placing of Manzanar under martial law as a protection for the people of Manzanar and Inyo County.

"Whenever, in the opinion of military police, complete order has been restored and the FBI and other Government agencies
