

Fourth Executive Board Meeting --- Wed. April 3, 1935

At Bob Sakamoto's Home

Meeting called to order by Pres. Sakamoto. Details of the Petition to protest the Anti-Japanese Legislation at Sacramento during the present session of Congress was discussed and fully explained. Plans were made to have each of the Executive Board members spend at least one day in the ~~coming~~ coming week to have the local citizens sign the Petition. It was then to be submitted to the other members for further soliciting.

Internal matters regarding our Advisors were discussed and the following recommendations were made:

1. That we add to our present Advisory Board by securing ^{Mr. Kodama,} the office of Mr. Ogawa, and Mr. Takiguchi, thereby making it an Advisory Board of ~~Four~~ persons.

2. To raise the moral level of our general meetings by banning all smoking, drinking, and such unnecessary rowdiness. To give President full power to use force in this issue.

3. That we encourage and practice expatriation immediately.

4. Plans for the possible purchase of motion picture "Nisei Parade" and sponsoring "Parents' Night" was referred to Pub. Mgr. Kaz Oka.

Plans for making Callendar was referred to Pub. Relations Board by President Sakamoto.

The date for the fourth general meeting was set for Thursday April 18. Meeting was adjourned for refreshments.
