The meeting was called to order by M. Hayashida, Chairman.

ROLL CALL

COMMUNICATION REVIEWED

A. A letter from Minidoka Community Council pertaining to the closing of schools before the closing of the center.

The minutes of April 3rd, were corrected to read as follows: under Picnic Committee G. Nakaki, Information Committee will be transferred to the Program Committee and Mr. F. Inoshita of the Program Committee to the Information Committee.

Mr. K. Akashi gave a report in regards to the all-center conference.

Mr. E. Hoshizaki reported on the negotiations with C. E. for the All-Center Conference traveling funds.

S. Fujimoto, informed the Council concerning the menu planned for the center-wide Farewell Picnic.

Mr. Anderson, suggested that the Council give more aid in assisting the residents in relocating and in getting people from the same locality to meet to discuss common problems of relocation. He also discussed with the Council the plans for having a final report prepared by the Council giving the evacuee's point of view concerning center program and operations. He suggested that this report be started as soon as possible and if desired, the Community analyst could assist in organizing the material. He stated that Mr. Myer had forwarded a copy of a letter in regards to the withdrawal of the Spanish Government in handling the Japanese alien affairs in the U. S. This letter will be printed in the bulletin in both English and Japanese, for the benefit of aliens.

He emphasized that the Social Welfare Section is assisting needy families in making plans for aid from welfare agencies at places where they relocate and emphasized the importance of such families initiating immediate relocation planning.

A motion was made by S. Fujimoto to revive the Relocation Planning Commission. This was unanimously passed. The Relocation Committee is to meet with Mr. Anderson April 11 to develop organization plans to be recommended to the Council.

S. Kodama of the Legal Committee gave a report on the Preliminary Hearing Board as related to recent cases.

The editorial of the Sentinel was discussed and was referred to Committee.

The meeting was adjourned 11:50 a.m.
