Meeting was called to order by M. Hayasuda, Chairman.

ROLL CALL

Attended: Mr. Kobayashi (25 proxy) and Mr. M. O. Anderson

The minutes of April 6th and 10th were approved as read.

COMMUNICATIONS REVIEWED:

A. An amendment and supplement to the declaration of trust of Community Enterprises was received.

B. A copy of letter to Mr. Robertson from Mr. Selon T. Kimball, Head of Community Organization & Activities Section, in regards to the final report of the Community Council.

Telegram

It was unanimously approved by the Council to send a telegram of condolence to Mrs. E. Roosevelt.

Picnic

S. Donao gave a report on the meeting of the Program Committee.

S. Fujimoto gave a report on the physical plan of the picnic. The picnic was postponed to May 20th because of uncertain weather conditions expected previous to that date.

Planning Committee

A. Nakaki reported concerning creation of Relocation Planning Commission. The proposal for the organization is as follows:

- (a) Commission to consist of Organization representation.
- (b) Representatives from each block only.
- (c) Or combination of both plans.
- (d) For consultation on relocation the relocation committee recommended that a convenient office for the planning Commission be established in the area.

It was unanimously agreed to send a letter to Topaz in regards to the letter received from Mr. M. Pitts.

A motion was made by F. Hoshizaki seconded by K. Hatchimonji that the Council appoint the 5 delegate to the all center conference as special committee to expedite the resolutions pass at that conference.

Mr. M. O. Anderson informed the Council of the change in the process of getting Depot Passes. He indicated that all such passes are to be obtained through his office.

It was agreed that the Public Relation Committee will consult with Mr. Robertson further about this procedure. This new procedure will be published both in the Sentinel and bulletin.

Mr. Anderson was questioned in regards to the issuance of clothing allowances for people over 65 years of age. He stated that persons who are able to work are expected to earn their clothing allowance through suitable employment. He stated that through an error, certain old records had failed to receive the last clothing allowance but this had been corrected.

The Council was informed that the Sentinel will publish the letter of the Council to the editor.

G. Kurasaki informed the Council that Mr. Kumei, former Council man, is now in the Mayo Clinic and will lose his eye sight. The Council unanimously agreed to send a letter of sympathy to him.

The meeting was adjourned 11:50 a.m.
