The meeting was called to order by M. Hayashida, Chairman.

ROLL CALL

Attended: T. Nobayashi (25 proxy), M. Matsura (27 proxy), Mr. Ritchie, Dave Yamakawa, (C. A.), Mr. I. Yamasaki, and Mr. Beltt.

The minutes of April 17th were approved as read.

COMMUNICATION REVIEWED:

- A. An introductory letter of Mr. Beltt from the C. E. Trust.
- B. Copy of letter to Mr. Masaru Nishihara, chairman of All-Center Conference, from Amacne Community Council.
- C. An invitation to a "Thank You" movie from the Heart Mountain V.B.I.
- D. A letter was received from Mr. Roger W. Baldwin, in regards to the exclusion of citizens from the West Coast.

Since many indorsements to the motion made by the Community Council were received, the Council recommended to All-Center Conference Office that it negotiate with the Washington WRA to keep the center schools open for the duration of the Center.

M. Hayashida informed the Council that the printing of the Japanese section of Mr. Myer's letter will be delayed.

Mr. Dave Yamakawa asked the aid of the Council in securing donations from the C. E. for the upkeep of the C. A. The Council suggested that a memo be sent to the C. E.

Mr. Beltt was introduced to the Council, after a short introductory speech, Mr. Beltt explained cooperatives and their functions, and factors involved in the liquidation of Community Enterprises. A prolong discussion was held on the refunds, unclaimed and etc. of the C. E.

T. Shoguchi, Health Committee, informed the Council of the closing of Ward 7. He also asked the Council to urge the residents to help the hospital by having more nurses aides and other workers.

Mr. S. Fujimoto stated that there will be a picnic committee meeting Thursday afternoon at the C.A.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:10 noon.
