The meeting was called to order by M. Hayashida, Chairman.

ROLL CALL

COMMUNICATION REVIEWED:

A. Report from Minidoka Community Council concerning their relocation and census report as follows: Relocated evacuees during the month of May 1945. Washington 168, Oregon, 178, California 14, and to other points 387. The evacuees still residing in Center 5,615.

B. Block Managers sent their list of representatives for Education Committee, Mr. Joe Honda, Mr. Shingo Nishiura, and Mr. Tomonao Iino.

Introduced by Mr. W. O. Anderson: Miss Shipps WRA Medical social official in San Francisco, and Miss Scott, Medical Social worker of Heart Mountain.

1039 cases were left in the evacuated area during these last three years due to illness. 450 of these cases were well enough to relocate or return to join their families during this period. Patients have been very well cared for and there has been very little prejudice in hospitals. Miss Shipps pointed out the importance of early arrangements for the transfer of medical patients to outside institutions.

Miss Scott, Medical Social Worker, stated that the patients' medical history is first and admission to west coast institutions assured before transportation is arranged to points of destination. Special effort is being made to bring about early transfer of tuberculosis patients.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
