COMMUNICATION:

A. Letter from Director Dillon S. Myer in answer to the letter of September 28 regarding resettlement grant.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

It was stated by Mr. Wiseman, Chief Steward, that orders have been put in for fresh fruits and vegetables.

Since there is a critical shortage of workers at the hospital, it was stated that the hospital may close on the 15th of this month if workers are not obtained to fill the vacancies.

DISCUSSIONS:

Mr. Kawano and Mr. Honda were requested by the Council to see Mr. Anderson pertaining to the matter of having all essential workers stay on the job until the operations are closed in the camp.

The Relocation Committee will look into the matter of housing situation.

Mr. Main, Procurement and Supply Officer, was present and stated that 5 carloads of coal will arrive Monday and 10 to 12 carloads will come in during the week. The councilmen and volunteers will again help the regular coal crew.

The Labor Committee was requested to consult Mr. Main about paying the volunteers who are not employed at the center in cash.

Due to the fact that the councilmen will be helping the coal crew Tuesday morning, the regular meeting will be postponed until Wednesday, October 17th.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:10 a.m.
