The subscription series of eighteen concerts by the Minneapolis Symphony Orchestra in Northrop Memorial Auditorium at the University of Minnesota during the coming winter, offers a splendid roster of Guest Artists and Conductors. DIMITRI MITROPOULOS, the Orchestra's own brilliant Conductor will direct fifteen of the concerts. During his absence in December when he will direct four Sunday Broadcasts of the N. B. C. Symphony Orchestra and two concerts of the Rochester New York Philharmonic, noted Guest Conductors will occupy the local podium. YVES CHARDON, the Orchestra's gifted Assistant Conductor, will direct the concert of December 14. LEONARD BERNSTEIN, brilliant young Conductor and Composer will conduct the concert of Dec. 21. ERICH LEINSDORF, famed Conductor of the Wagnerian repertoire at the New York Metropolitan Opera and permanent Conductor of the Cleveland Orchestra since 1943, will conduct an all-Wagner program with Helen Traubel as assisting artist on Dec. 28.

The list of Guest Artists embraces the names of many of the greatest musical personalities of our time. ALEXANDER UNINSKY, famous Russian Pianist, makes his local debut on March 15. ALBERT SPALDING, the popular American Violinist will return on March 29, after an absence of eight years. WITOLD MALCUZYNSKI and WILLIAM KAPELL, pianists who won outstanding acclaim in their local debuts with the Orchestra last season, will be heard at the concerts of January 4 and January 25. MARIAN ANDERSON will appear at the regular subscription concert of Nov. 23 and at an extra concert the following night. ISAAC STERN, brilliant young Violinist who captivated local audiences two years ago, will be the season's first guest at the concert of Nov. 2. RUDOLF SERKIN, HELEN TRAUBEL, ZINO FRANCESCATTI, YEHUDI MENUHIN, and CLAUDIO ARRAU, frequent guests at the Symphony concerts, will be warmly welcomed by their local admirers.
