He was enrolled in the student training program of the Army and went to Amherst college. He was assigned to active duty in January, 1945, and went overseas in August of that year, serving in Europe until his discharge in August, 1946. He is now at work on the farm of his mother, Mrs. I. Shibata, in Garland.
