

COLORADO DRIVE FOR ALL-STATE WAC UNIT IS ON

Young Denver Club Women
to See Training Films
At Legion Hall.

Colorado's part in a national campaign to recruit Wac companies from each of the forty-eight states, proclaimed officially in this state by Governor Vivian, will receive its first stimulus in Denver Thursday when young club women of the city will be entertained by the Wac recruiting service at the American Legion Hall, 901 East Seventeenth avenue.

Mrs. Emil Lindl is in charge of the program, Lieut. Sarah Reed of the Denver recruiting office said, and has arranged an interesting showing of movie film on Wacs in training and at work.

A Wac enlistee for each war casualty of each state is contemplated under the plan conceived by the war department, the governor said. The full quota must be met by Dec. 7. The first contingent will leave for training Oct. 12.

The governor said the volunteers making up Colorado's company will be sworn in together at mass ceremonies at the statehouse, will be identified by the state's shoulder insignia and will receive basic training as one unit. Each state unit will carry its own state flag which will be installed in "The Hall of Flags" after the war is over.

H. E. Green has been appointed the governor's personal representative in the recruiting campaign, and will be assisted in the Denver area by Mrs. A. B. Grissom.
