

# WAC Officers Visitors Here

Visitors to the local recruiting office of the Women's Army Corps, located in the city hall building, were Lieutenant Peggy Davies, in charge of the Colorado recruiting district, and Lieutenant Sarah Reed, liaison officer in the office of Governor John C. Vivian.

The officers were here to check WAC recruiting in Weld county, with Lt. Julia Adams, in charge of recruiting for the northern and eastern districts in Weld. The next unit of Colorado girls to take training at Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., is slated to leave Denver Nov. 11, and the quota for this county is 36 recruits.

Both officers expressed disappointment in the lack of response of Greeley and Weld county girls and women in answering the call for WAC enlistment.

Lt. Adams is eager to contact any local women interested in enlistment. She has called for interviews in many cases, but there are many others that she's been unable to reach. Those girls interested are asked to telephone the WAC office, 80 for appointment, or go to the office for an interview. It is located on the second floor of the city hall, Eighth avenue and Seventh street.

Governor Vivian, responsible for filling the Colorado company quota, works directly thru Lt. Reed in the organization of this unit, a part of the All-States plan of enlistment. Volunteers who make up the state company of the WAC will receive basic training together, wear the state's shoulder patch, which carries also the distinctive insignia of the All-State division.
