

WAC Will Marry In White At Post Chapel Tomorrow

A romance which developed amid the training manual-loaded shelves of the Post Publications Office will be culminated tomorrow evening when Pfc. Irene L. Papke of Headquarters Company, SCU 1111-W, will be married to Cpl. Philip A. Chapman of Post Headquarters Company at the Post Chapel.

It will be the first soldier-Wac marriage since authorization was granted recently to Wacs to wear the traditional wedding gown rather than the GI uniform.

Chaplain Edward R. Kenealy, post chaplain, will officiate. Mrs. Dorothy Roberts, sister of the bride-to-be, will be matron of honor and Coxswain William Daly, U. S. Coast Guard, will be best man. Cpl. Francis W. Roy, formerly of Headquarters Company and now attached to the Reception Center, and Sgt. Bernard McGrath, of Headquarters Company, will be ushers.

Pfc. Papke is the daughter of Mrs. Papke of Rice Lake, Wis. She was educated in Minneapolis and enlisted in the WAAC in February, 1943, was transferred to Devens in May, and assigned to the Publications Office where Cpl. Chapman was in charge.
