I'm so glad the other Japanese girls are still with you, and glad that they are being friendly and making things pleasant for you.

My feet are getting no better fast. I'm going to the doctor in Denver again the 23rd, so I'm cutting down more and more on my work.

Ruth is O. K. and you wouldn't believe how well she is. She weighs 110 and looks grand.

She and Barney have definitely quit and she is going steady now with a young man who teaches in Greeley High. He is 4 years older than she and just a little taller. Very different from Barney.

I feel sorry for Barney. He is still trying to convince her that he loves her more than any one else ever will.

Dick is still in Denver at Sears. He had a little case of blood poisoning

a couple of weeks ago and lost several days from work. He still come home every week end and gets homesick in between.

We had a little winter yesterday and to-day. Tried to snow bath days and was quite cold.

Frank has been having some rough experiences. Hank says Agnes keeps up on the news for you so I expect she has told you about them.

Saw a clipping about Ben in the paper the other day. Thought I'd cut it out for you but felt sure your folks would do it.

Don't feel hurt, Sue, if I don't get your letters answered. I have to be in the mood for letters, and I find I'm too nervous for any but Frank's most of the time.

So glad you are happy in the Waco and hope it continues to be as interesting.
