

Shoe Ration Cards Valid for Only 30 Days

Shoe purchase certificates issued to the evacuees are valid for only 30 days, according to an announcement by the local rationing board in Cody.

If 30 days has elapsed since the date of issuance, new certificates will be issued upon presentation of expired ones outside the employment section in the administration building, John A. Nelson, senior administrative officer, announced.

Nelson advised residents not to rush in to have certificates exchanged unless they intend to purchase shoes.
