

Instructions for Clean-up Week Released

The clean-up week which ends on Saturday, April 24, aims to accomplish three objectives: 1) to reduce fire hazards; 2) to promote cleanliness and sanitation; 3) to prepare the groundwork for the beautification of the project compound. The instructions set forth will help and guide you in attaining these aims.

What should be done:

- a) Coal pile-----Reduce the piles between the barracks into one; build it nearest the road end of the barracks.
- b) Ashes-----Scrape up and gather near the trash pile for the dump trucks to collect. Wet the ash before leaving it.
- c) Lumber-----Remove all lumber from under the front steps and attic; make a neat pile in the north or south end of the barrack if you must keep them. Lumber under the steps are fire hazards. Discard those which you do not need, including the ones kept within the apartment, and place them in a pile near the road.
- d) Board walks-----Remove all boards used for walks and dispose of them as above in (c). Blueprints are available at Block office. Plan your new walk accordingly.
- e) Combustible materials--Remove same from around the stove and at the same time check for any possible defect in stove and chimney. Report to the fire department if any defect is found.
- f) Rubbishes-----Make piles near the road for the trucks to collect.
- g) Cans-----Dispose same behind the mess hall. Do not mix with other trash.
- h) Garbage-----Clean up those thrown behind the barracks. The ground soiled by garbage should be shoveled under. (Until more convenient arrangement can be made, use the mess hall garbage can).
- i) Sinks-----Those who have built sink within their apartment should remove same for reason of sanitation.
- j) Barrack wall----Bank the wall with at least 12 inches of soil. Refer to blue-prints which show plans for drainage, etc.
- k) Levelling of the ground--Give consideration to drainage, safety, and future landscaping. Refer to blueprints.

Equipment

All equipment will be picked up Monday, April 26, and every piece must be accounted for at that time.

Trucks for Pick-up

Beginning today, few trucks will be making regular rounds of the project compound to collect and carry away rubbishes, scrap lumber, ashes, etc. which are piled up beside the road. On April 24, the final day of the clean-up week, a sufficient number of trucks will be made available all day to complete work.

Division of Labor

In general, cleaning up of each block compound is left up to the block residents under the guidance of special committee appointed by the block chairman in each block for this specific purpose.

Warehouse area, hospital, and the administration area, however, are to be cleaned by Caucasian staff and the evacuee employees. High school ground in block 7 and the new high school grounds will be cleaned by the students under the direction of Student association. Blocks 5 and 26 will be cleaned by boys' clubs and boy scouts.

Cleaning of Apartment

Cleaning of the interior of apartment is left to the discretion of the occupants. If any member of the family is ill with cold, cleaning up may be deferred. However, paper, boxes, lumber, etc. which are not needed should be taken out and placed among other trash at the pile near the roadside during the clean-up week.

Inspection

This is also left to the discretion of the block clean-up committee.

Beautification

The beautification program is a long time plan, but some groundwork for it can be made in conjunction with the clean-up. A more detailed plan will be displayed to the residents at a later date but enough information for the present is available from the blueprints which are in the hands of the clean-up committee in your block.

Prep Students Participate in Clean-up Week

In conjunction with the center-wide clean-up campaign, high school students will take a day off from studies tomorrow to clean up the campus. The clean-up will be followed by a baseball rally and a game between Lovell and Heart Mountain.

Classes will meet as usual at 8:40 a.m. for home room and first period. This

will present players of the Lovell and Heart Mountain teams. After the game a social sponsored by the Pep club will entertain the visitors at 7-27.

Holy Communion Scheduled Tonight

In observance of Easter week, the Community Christian church will hold Holy Communion at 7 p.m., tonight, at 22-26. "The Way of Life," an Easter drama, directed by Eiko Yokota will be presented by the senior department of the Sunday school at 7:30 p.m. tomorrow at 22-26. This department is also in charge of the Good Friday service. In the cast are Andy Fujiwara, Hisayo Saijo, Ryoko Hayashi, Sachie Ueda, Dave Nakamura and Jean Kishi. Music will be rendered by the youth choir. Joyce Koga will be chairman for the service.

Month-End Sale Announced by Dry Goods Store
