Residents were discouraged from writing directly to Chambers of Commerce and other local agencies for informational material in a memorandum received from Dillon S. Myer, national WRA director. His memorandum read in part:

"The appropriate relocation officers should be requested to secure this material. They are in a position to make personal contacts and explain the work of the Authority in making such requests. Requests made by members of the project staff and by evacuees have caused misunderstanding and suspicion on the part of some local agencies, which would not have occurred had a personal contact and explanation been made by a relocation officer."
