N O T I C E

TO: ALL EVACUEE RESIDENTS OF THE FRESNO ASSEMBLY CENTER

FROM: E. P. PULLIAM, CENTER MANAGER

The following Center regulations will become effective on Wednesday, August 5, 1942 and will be strictly enforced by the Interior Police:

1. All radios and lights of every kind in all evacuee's quarters shall be turned off by the occupants not later than 11:30 P.M. Lights shall remain off throughout the hours of darkness - exceptions to lighting regulations will be permitted in case of fire, sickness, pregnant mothers, mothers with young children, and other necessary cases when written permission has been obtained from the Center Manager.
2. All evacuees shall be in their own living quarters between 10:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. (the area immediately adjacent to the quarters will be considered as a part thereof) - exceptions will be permitted when persons are going to and from the nearest lavatory, or when necessary in caring for sick persons, and for the purpose of visiting the bath houses between the hours of 10:30 and 11:30 P.M. Evacuees when assigned to any work between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. shall be provided by their Division head with a written exemption to this ruling in form of a pass. This exemption will be shown on demand to the Interior Police Officers on duty.
3. Existing regulations pertaining to the nightly check between the hours of 10:00 and 10:30 P.M. remain in full force.
4. Property, articles or equipment belonging to or in custody of the U. S. Government or any of its agencies shall not be moved by Evacuees from one building or location to another location, except with written permission by the Center Manager.
5. The possession of or serving of foods which require heating or cooking, will not be allowed in the quarters of the evacuees. This does not apply to formula foods for infants. Violations of the above will be reported to the Interior Police, who will confiscate without compensation all such articles delivering them to Mess and Housing Section of this Center.
6. All Japanese phonograph records, whether instrument or vocal music or speeches, will be turned in to the office of the Internal Police Department not later than July 27, 1942.
7. The possession of perishable foods, excepting fresh fruits, will not be allowed.
8. Parents are required to properly and thoroughly instruct their children in these regulations and the necessity for obedience thereto. In those families which contain members who cannot read, it will be the duty of the oldest adult who can read to instruct the non-readers in the above regulations.
