My dear Mr. Elwood:

Request for removal.

This letter will represent you a written request for removal from Triplex 3 A to a bungalow. Previously I personally contacted the german representative in charge of billeting, Mr. Glattfelder, who promised permission and approval of removal to a bungalow on or about July 1.

At this time I asked and recieved no favorable response. Then I took the matter up again with Mr. Gurke with no satisfaction.

However I appreciate their cooperation, but not recieving favorable results have resorted to your discretion and assistance. I have three boys, aged 7, 4 and 2 years, and my wife is expecting another child within a few months. - Therfor the necessity for more living space and the comfort for my wife under these trying circunstances. I would appreciate you giving this matter your kind attention and please advise me of your decision. If convenient, I can ~~hand~~ the matter ~~over~~ over with you personally for any other necessary information you may desire.
