MEMORANDUM from Medical Division
to Liaison Division Att. Mr. Elwood

In the case of Mr. and Mrs. Schnellbach and family, I can see no particular reason why preferential treatment should be accorded them on a medical basis. Mrs. Schnellbach states that at 19 years of age, she had an attack of rheumatic fever. She has a slight irregularity of the heart at the present time but no evidence of organic heart disease. Mr. Schnellbach is active and free from any ailments. One of their children is supposed to have had rickets at an earlier period of his life. Inasmuch as there are many other families in camp that have more serious medical problems, I do not feel justified in recommending preferential treatment in their case.
