Officers elected for the year were Ayako Sugino, president; Grace Murakami, vice president; Kazuko Kita, secretary; and Mildred Uyeda, song leader.

In this club, we try to raise the moral standard of these young girls by giving them good Christian fellowship, and teaching them to follow Christ's teaching by serving others.

In February, colorful valentines were made by the girls for the patients in the hospitals. The cards were greatly appreciated by the sick people. Later, scrap books of all kinds were made. Each girl made a different kind of scrap book such as a book of jokes, of comical animals, food, clothing, animals pretty girls, etc. These books were given to the boys and girls in the hospital who have nothing to do but lie in bed.

Parties, picnics, and hiking trip to the mountains were enjoyed by these girls.

With Miyeko Kawata and Hisako Aoki as advisers, the Busy Bee girls have tried to live as Christ would want them to live.

PARISH I CHOIR

Twenty-five boys and girls faithfully turn out and find real fellowship in singing. One of the outstanding features was the presentation to the parents on July 31, when a special Vesper Service was held.

Girls Corps

Under the advisorship of Miss Tsumura, the Girls Corps of Parish I is rapidly advancing. This fine group consists of Junior Church girls from the ages of twelve to sixteen. To keep in time with the present day, these girls have formed an army. This group is God's army and have for its aim "to help others".

Meetings are held every other week. The members must work for offices such as Private, First Class Private, Corporal, Sergeant, and a few other different types of offices held in the army. They earn these offices by attending two handicraft meetings, or bringing two girls that are willing to join the club, or being a song leader for one meeting, or giving a devotion, or a prayer, or being a chairman of a meeting, or passing out invitations to club members, and many other things listed in the constitution.

The girls have already gone on a hike with lunches, washed their church windows, made scrap books for young and old people who are in the hospital, made carnations for Mothers' Day, and made curtains for their church windows.

Desert Air Force

Under the able advisorship of Mr. Paul Itaya, the junior boys of Parish I meet every Thursday at 7:30 P.M. Mr. Teruo Kawata and Mr. Haruto Shimazu assist in their diversified program.

In keeping with the name of the club, the boys are organized under aeronautic theme. Military drills, model airplane construction, and army rank system are the novelties of this group. Hikes, church clean-up, window curtain rods and Junior Church usher work are all part of the project undertaken by the boys.

The prayer meetings of Parish II Junior Church are held every Wednesday night usually at the Parish II Church Office at Block 53-14-B. The program usually begins with a pre-service sing. The meeting is then opened with a word of prayer. The speaker gives his talk or occasionally there is a discussion. At present approximately twenty people attend these meetings, but the number is steadily increasing. A few weeks ago, we had Reverend Still and his two daughters from Phoenix at our prayer meeting. The members of the prayer meeting have been divided into four groups, each with a leader. Group I is lead by Lloyd Fujimoto, group II, Harry Baba, group III, May Ono, and group IV, Yeiko Baba. Each group tries to bring as many of their friends as they can. In this way, more attend our prayer meetings and more are spiritually uplifted.

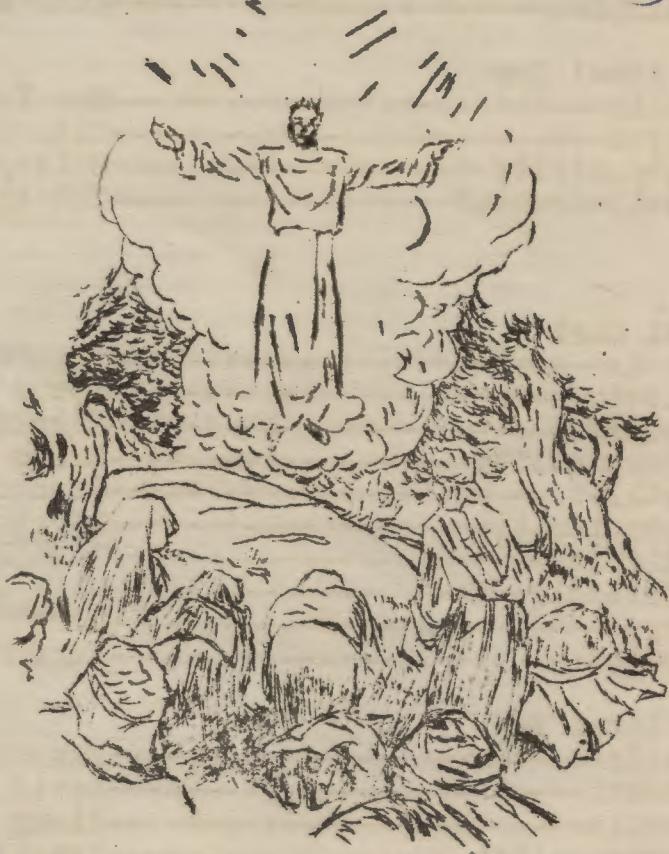
