Housing Space to Be Made for New Center Arrivals

In preparation for housing the new residents scheduled to be sent to this center from Jerome, Ark., a program of providing additional housing space is being started, Howard R. Embree, housing director, announced.

This process will involve: (1) rearranging the occupancy of small apartments in which only family member remains; (2) moving families of five members or less now occupying two-room apartments into one of the two rooms; and (3) moving family groups who have been reduced to two members but who are still living in a large apartment into a small one.

In order to take care of the new residents, at least 65 vacancies must be made, plus the vacant apartments that are now on hand and the openings that will be made by the segregation movement from this center to Tule Lake next month.

Families of two members living in a medium or large sized apartment should contact the housing field office at 21-26-N promptly for new assignments. First volunteers for such moves will get the most satisfactory locations, Embree said.
