

Lost and Found Department to Be Located at Police Department Effective June 15

Lost and found articles will be held for a period of 30 days during which time proper notification will be given to the residents. At the expiration of this time, unclaimed articles will be returned to the finder and receipt given to the police department for the article.

250 Men Needed for Vital War Work in Chicago

At least 250 nisei men are needed by the International Harvester Co., Chicago, for work vital to the war effort, according to Joe Carroll, relocation officer. The company's personnel manager will come to the project next week to interview prospective employees.

Work will be in the radiator and machine shops. Rate of pay will range from 77 cents per hour for unskilled up to \$1.15 for skilled and semi-skilled workers. Personnel security applications need not be completed until workers are on the job, but Carroll emphasized that only citizens will be employed.

Exact date of the personnel manager's arrival as well as additional information about the offer will be published in Saturday's Sentinel or in an early Sentinel Supplement.
