

New Procedure for Collecting and Reissuing of Blankets Announced

Through an agreement reached between Howard Embree, associate counselor, and the block managers, a new procedure in the collection and reissuing of blankets to those returning from seasonal leave will be put into effect, it was announced. In the future, all persons leaving the center will turn in their blankets to the block managers' offices. Residents coming back to the center from seasonal work will call at the block managers' offices for the necessary reissue.

This plan will be tried out for a limited time, Embree said, and if it proves to be successful, it will become a permanent procedure.

A seasonal cannery job offer has been received for 140 women from the Bear River packing company of Perry, Utah, and registration will begin tomorrow morning, it was announced by the outside employment office. The period of employment is from July 8 to October 15, with the rate of pay to be 55 cents per hour. The work will be in processing fruits and vegetables for freezing plants. Each applicant must personally sign a War Manpower commission contract at the outside employment office.
