Residents who have not alresdy done so are urged by Byron Ver Ploeg, projeot attornoy, to make out wills or otherwise provile for the settlement of their property affairs. Numorous casos have come to the attcntion of the project attorney, ospecially in ceses where only a small amount of property is involved, where a little forettght would have saved ondless diffioulties for the witiow or ohildron upon the doath of the head of a houschold, Ver Ploog said.

Persons who have no near relatives in this country are rominded in perticular to make definite provision for their property. Frequently such persons loave govormmut bonds, government oheoks, monoy, personal offects, otc., and it becomes diffie cult or impossiblo to duliver tho proporty to any porson or to cash the diocks end bonds, accordink to Ver Ploeg.

Wilis or eschett proceedinos may ofton be avoided by such devices at joint bank accounts, joint ownership of bonds or othor property, he said. Since \& will wilich does not comply with the requirements of the law is no bettor then no will et all, Vor Ploog statca thet residents should make use of tho facilitios of his office in the drafting of the wills. The servico is porformed free of cherge.
