JAPANESE FORM A LABOR TRUST

Industrial Company Organizes
to Supply All Kinds of
Workers.

What bears semblance to a Japanese labor trust has been organized in this city, and articles for its incorporation, under the name of the United Industrial Company, were filed yesterday in the office of the County Clerk. The avowed purposes of the company are to take steps necessary "to keep fields and lands in good working condition"; to secure laborers, both skilled and unskilled; to contract to furnish laborers for the construction of railroads, both steam and electric, and, in general, to supply labor, obviously Japanese, for all desirous of securing it.

The capital stock is placed at \$200,000, in shares of \$50 each, one share having already been subscribed by each of the seven directors—H. Senow, M. Akimoto, S. Miho, K. Iki, S. Kurofshi, Y. Maeda and B. Washizu.
