


THE WHITE HOUSE

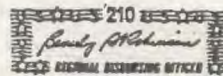
