I am in receipt of your letter of Nov. 30, 1943 regarding my request ~~for~~ review of my removal from employment on ~~the~~ Army & Navy Department contracts.

To supplement my record you ~~requested~~ ^{instructed} ~~that~~ me in ^{the use of} two methods in submitting my case.

I would like to submit my case under method 1, and as for submitting affidavits and documents I have a ^{California} birth certificate and a Japanese citizenship cancellation ^{document} ~~papers~~, but ~~would not like~~ ^{Refuse} ~~to~~ let them out of my possession ^{would not like to} as I could not replace them if they were lost. ^{especially the Japanese citizenship cancellation papers.}

~~At present I am employed as meat cutter with the National Sea Food Store in the city of Chicago and I work 6 days a week. I am unable to find an opportunity to~~

On the day of my removal from employment Nov. 3rd 1943 I was fingerprinted at the Census Press Building for the ^{South Branch St. 3rd floor} ~~10th~~ ^{corner} of Chicago.

At present I am employed 6 days a week and cannot find an opportunity to take time off ~~to~~ to go down for a ^{another} fingerprint as ~~it~~ would lose a days work which I cannot afford.

→ In hopes that it may help with the case I am enclosing several cards with my fingerprints, and picture.
