"FORTY - NINE YEARS AND FOUR MONTHS AGO, MAY 27, 1942, THE FIRST "COLONISTS" ARRIVED AT THE TULE LAKE WAR RELOCATION CAMP. THEY WERE RELOCATED WITHOUT CAUSE, CONFINED WITHOUT DUE PROCESS, THEIR RIGHTS AS AMERICAN DENIED, AND THEIR DIGNITY AS HUMAN VIOLATED. ALL THIS TOOK PLACE HERE AT TULE LAKE FROM MAY 1942 TO MARCH 1946, IN THE NAME OF THOSE WHO SWORE TO UPHOLD THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES."



BANCROFT LIBRARY IS LOCATED IN THE MAIN LIBRARY BUILDING AND IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. THIS LIBRARY IS THE DEPOSITORY OF THE WAR RELOCATION AUTHORITY (WRA) AND OTHER JAPANESE - AMERICAN FILES. THE LIBRARY HOURS ARE: M - F 9 - 5; Sa 1 - 5. ALL MATERIALS MUST BE REVIEWED IN THE LIBRARY. AT THE CHECK OUT DESK, ASK FOR THE JAPANESE - AMERICAN RELOCATION RECORDS. THIS IS A BLACK FOLDER WITH SUBJECT AND FILE NUMBERS. THE MATERIALS ARE UNDER FILE NUMBER 67/14 C. A GOOD WAY TO START YOUR RESEARCH IS BY READING THE FINAL REPORT (FILE 67/14C R 1.10). THIS REPORT SUMMARIZES THE ACTIVITIES OF EACH MAJOR AREAS OF THE TULE LAKE WRA ADMINISTRATION. EVEN THOUGH THESE ARE THE ADMINISTRATION'S VIEWS OF THE EVENTS, THE BASIC PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION AND DATA ARE THOUGHT TO BE ACCURATE. THE ACCURACY OF ONE DOCUMENT WAS VERIFIED BY OVERLAYING THE SITE PLAN (ENHANCED BY CADD) WITH CURRENT (1990) AERIAL PHOTOGRAPH. THE DATA AND LAYOUTS ARE FROM THIS AND OTHER FILES. THE TERM "COLONISTS" IS FIRST MENTIONED IN THIS REPORT.

\*\* THE CONSEQUENCE OF THIS INCIDENT WAS A TRAGEDY FAR BEYOND WHAT HAVE BEEN EXPERIENCED BY OTHER CAMP EVACUEES. THE EXPATRIATES WHO WERE SENT TO DEFEATED AND WAR TORN JAPAN EXPERIENCED EXTREME HARDSHIPS. EVENTUALLY DURING 1948 - 1953, THEY PETITIONED TO REGAIN THEIR CITIZENSHIP AND MANY RETURNED TO THE UNITED STATES. HOWEVER, BECAUSE OF LANGUAGE DIFFICULTIES AND MISSED OPPORTUNITIES, NEARLY ALL DID NOT RECEIVE THE EDUCATION WHICH THE NISEI'S WERE ABLE TO OBTAIN.



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
