tell me your grades. Out here
we don't have school but I
guess it will be in the near future.

Well it's pretty near a year
of war and it looks like we're in for
a long stay in this camp but
with the second front and all I
hope it will finish by next Christ-
mas.

Did you notice that I never
answer any questions you ask
on the your letters, well its
because I always lose the letter
before I write again. From now on
I'll try to do better.

How is the rationing affecting
you people. Out here in camp its
rationed too but we don't have
to worry about cards and we
don't use gasoline at all so that's out.

The southern accents these people
around here gets me. I couldn't
understand half of the things some
of the people are saying, but I'm
gradually getting used to it.

Well that's about all so goodbye
Tell Jim + Jack Hello
