Dear George

Just received your letter and promptly went after the packages. Thank you so much for your presents. Indeed I was surprised to see the bill fall out. The candy is very good. The first thing I did was to eat some and was it delicious I gave some to the family as everyone is very glad. As you mentioned the slippers are slightly big but I think it's much better than if it was smaller.

Our Christmas was far better than what I thought it to be. We had chicken and fruits and other stuff and candies. As for our school it has just begun. This is our second week of school but because of some mishap we have to start all over. When school started I quit my work which lasted for a month and I got my pay the other day of \$16 but just about spent it up. In school I'm taking Geometry, English, P.E., Social Science, Spanish and Study Period. Every morning we have what we call a Home Room which we did not have at E. G. In there we get instructions etc. There are about 1,200 pupils in our school it covers 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, + 12th grades. All the teachers here are very good, sometimes I couldn't understand their southern drawl.

Well I hope also that America win this war before Sept. so I could go to E. G. U. S. H. but I don't know about helping you, it seems like you're helping me. Goodbye and
