11.- B. Warehouse Section

Harvey P. Chandler

Maintains all supplies for the Project in a central warehouse and issues them as ordered by individual Divisions. Reviews articles on hand and needs of the community so that sufficient inventories can be kept on hand at all times for regular needs and for non-routine needs where possible. Is responsible for all property until it has been transferred to particular sections on the records of the Property Control Section.

11. - C. Mess Management Section

Fred Haller, Project Steward

Is responsible for preparing and serving meals to all resident Japanese through as many individual messes as are necessary. Maintains a large staff of stewards, cooks, and helpers for the carrying out of this work. Plans meals based upon diet program recommended by the Health Division and orders necessary food supplies through the Procurement Section.

11. - D. Property Control Section

Wm. S. Banta

Maintains complete and accurate records covering all items of property on the Project, purchased by, or belonging to, the Federal Government. Has no responsibility for personal property of Caucasian employees or Japanese residents.

12. PUBLIC WORKS DIVISION

Ben B. Lummis

Supervises and directs the public works program of the Project including the construction of all buildings, plants, warehouses, high-way projects, irrigation works, etc. Supervises and is responsible for a staff of employees engaged in maintaining and repairing all public

buildings and grounds of the community. Has charge of all engineering. Through four subordinate sections passes on general plans, established working plans approved by the Washington office. Maintains evacuee staff for (a) Janitor service in all buildings, (b) Trash disposal, (c) Garbage disposal, (d) Streets and alleys, (e) Departmental Warehouse.

12. - A. Design Section

Leon C. Goodrich

Provides general engineering office services for the Public Works division including engineering drafting, architectural planning and advice, coordination of buildings, advice on general engineering research. Works closely with other sections to provide a pool of such facilities to be made available as needed to the construction engineers, the carpenters, plumbers, electricians, etc.

12. B. - Engineering Section.

Richard N. Hull

Engineers and constructs roads, bridges, culverts, irrigation works, dams, and other public works on the Project. Subject to technical advise from Irrigation and Conservation technicians on appropriate projects.

12. C. - Carpenter Section.

Glenn E. Hill

Through a staff of colonists, augmented by whatever Caucasian help necessary, maintains a staff of carpenters, painters and performs such services as erecting partitions, doing construction work, painting buildings, repairing broken windows and maintaining the complete repair services for all public buildings.

12. D. - Plumbing Section

Rex Stanton

Maintains a staff of plumbers which services all plumbing equipment in all public buildings. Maintains a tin shop which makes any article called for by division heads. Maintains the water and sewer system and performs such construction as needed to provide complete sanitation for any new construction. Has charge of hot water heating and stoves throughout the entire project. Provides a welding shop where small welding jobs are done for the Project and the Community. Staff composed entirely of colonists.

12. E. - Electrical Section.

Richard Busted

Provides new construction and maintenance for power, communi-

cation and refrigeration services on the entire Project. Staff composed entirely of colonists.

12. F - Pump Station Section

George Downing

Maintains, operates water pump station and sewerage disposal plant for the entire community. Makes frequent bacterial count on the water and sends samples of same to the State Health Department for analysis at regular intervals. Staff consists of seven Caucasian pumpers, augmented by colonists.

12. G Maintenance Services

This division divided into (a) Janitorial services, under the supervision of two colonist supervisors, maintains a staff of janitors for all public buildings; (b) Trash, under the supervision of one colonist supervisor maintains a staff to collect and dispose of all trash throughout the Project. (c) Garbage, under the supervision of one colonist supervisor maintains a staff of colonists to collect and dispose of the garbage from the mess halls of the Project. (d) Streets and Alleys, under two colonist foremen maintains and repairs drains, gravel, etc, on streets and alleys within the Project. (e) Departmental warehouse; one colonist foreman augmented by colonist crew maintains records and acts as a stock clerk for a warehouse system serving all departments of this division.

13. EMPLOYMENT AND HOUSING DIVISION

Wm. J. Carroll

In charge of and responsible for the assignment and re-assignment of Japanese residents and Caucasian employees to appropriate housing accommodations within the Project. Supervises records of property owned by Japanese residents. Supervises recording of vital statistics, personal history, and occupational data for all Japanese residents and supplies statistical information concerning them to the Field and Washington offices. Supervises the placement of Japanese residents on Project jobs and attempts to find the most suitable employment for residents in terms of their past experience and training. Negotiates private employment for Japanese with potential employers in the neighboring area.
