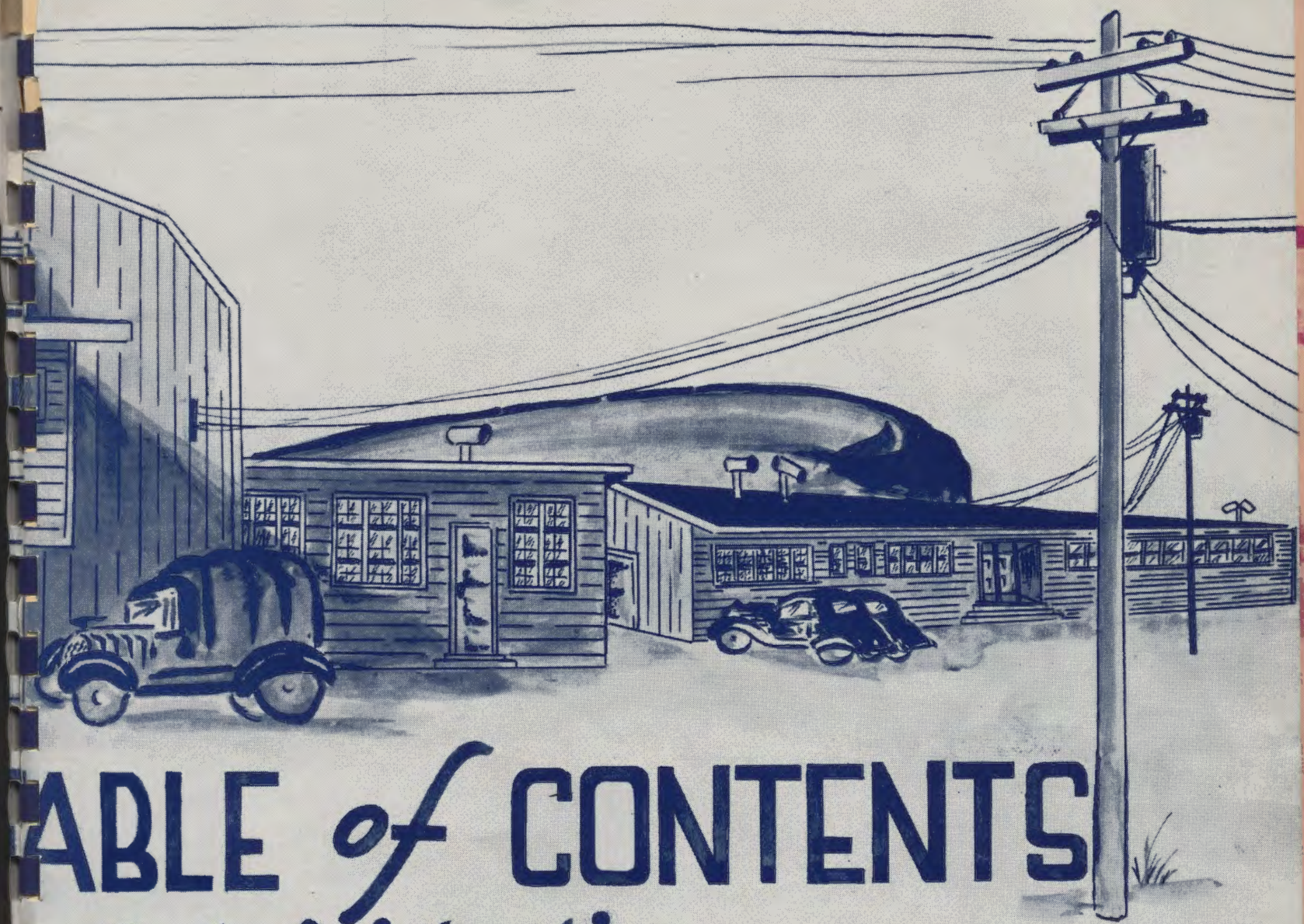

Which shines like the halos of angels of old.

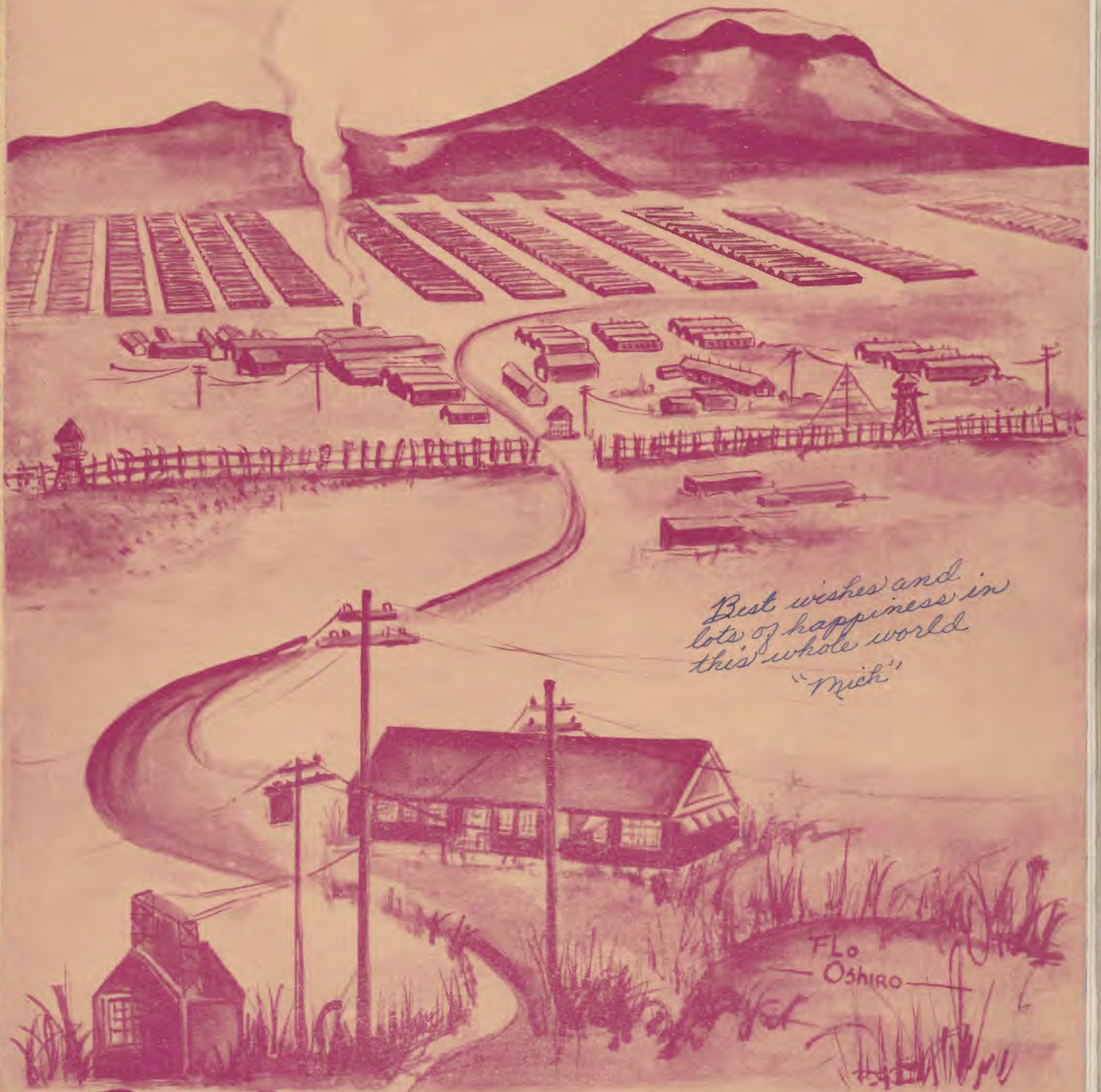
Then overhead the sky grows dark,

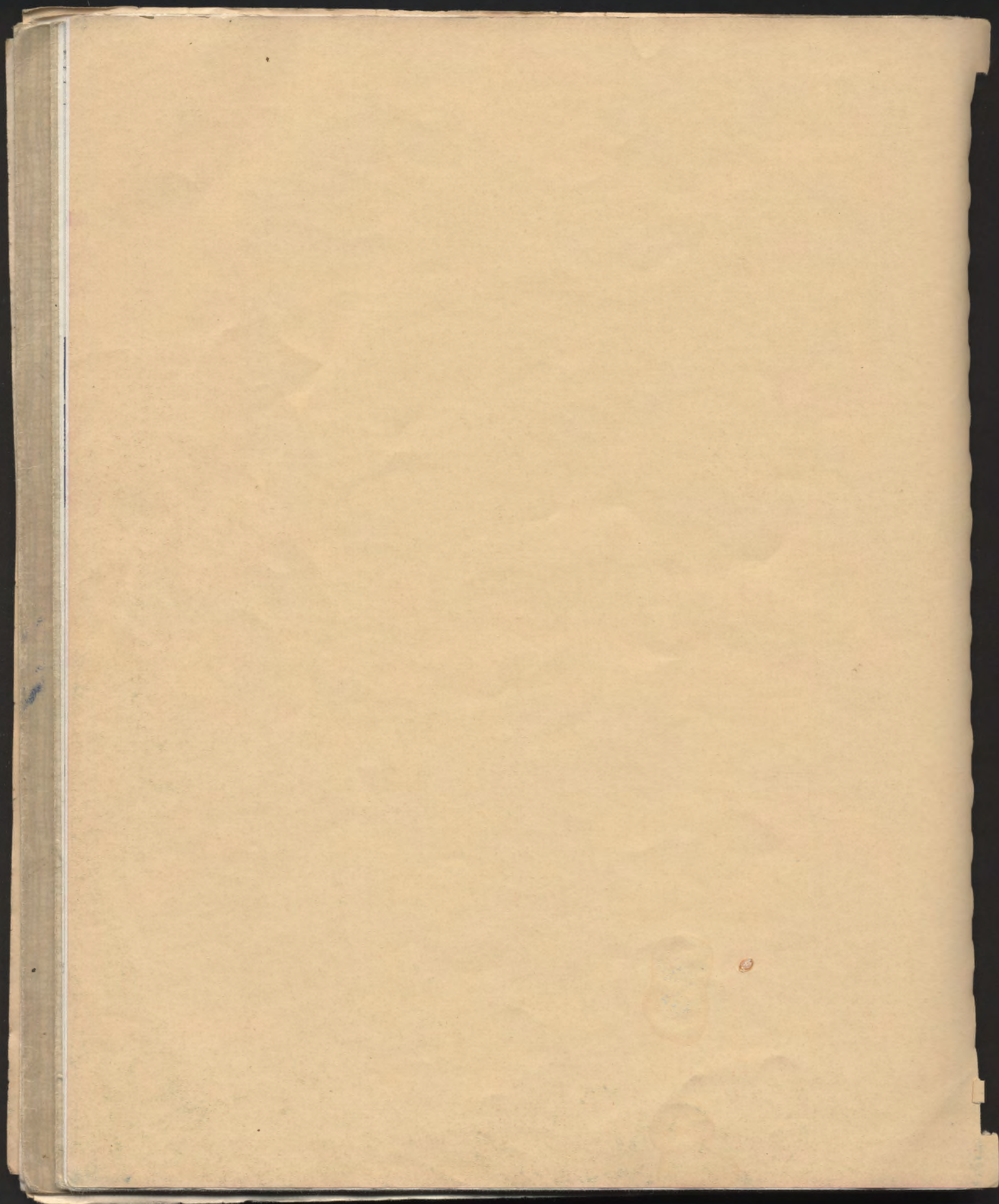

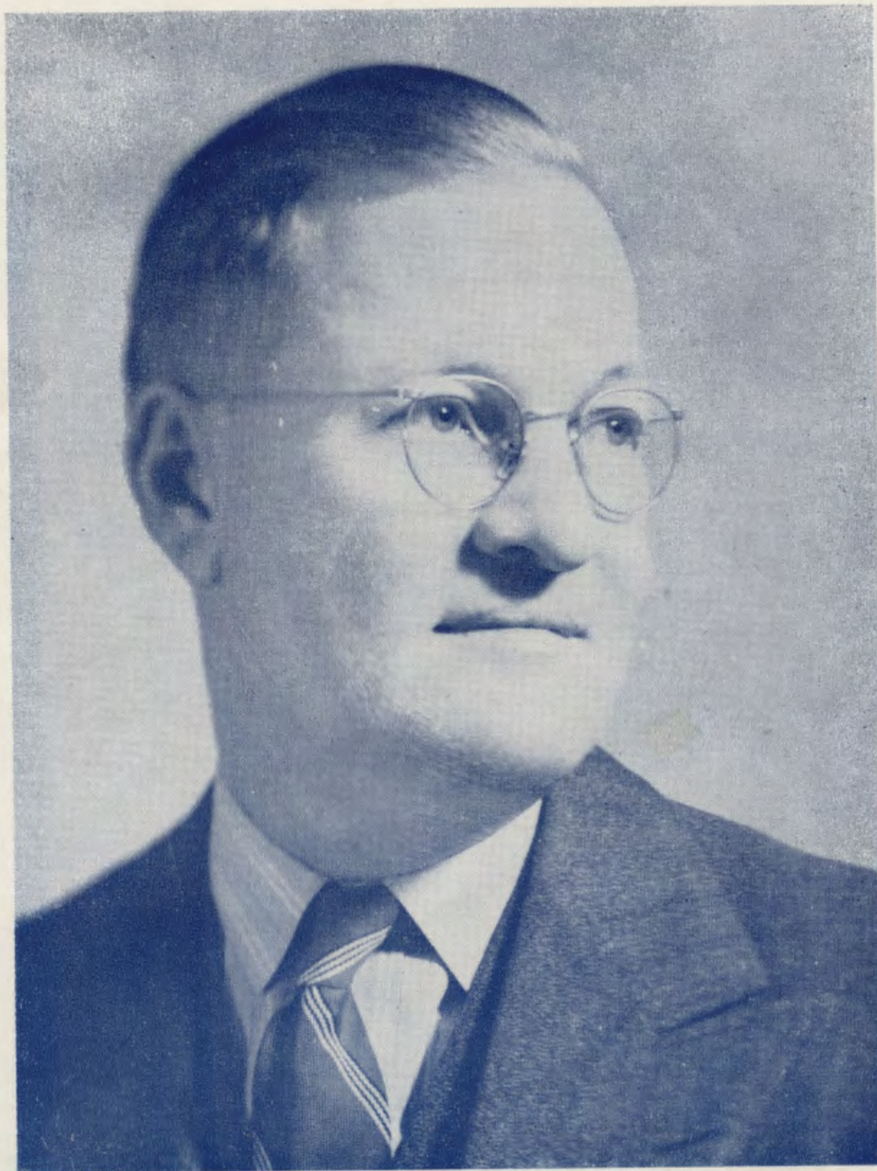
If you have learned these things, you are educated in the truest sense and can take your rightful place in your community. ~

Our congratulations are extended to the Senior Class of 1944; may you follow the Aquila, going ever higher and higher until your loftiest ideals have been reached.

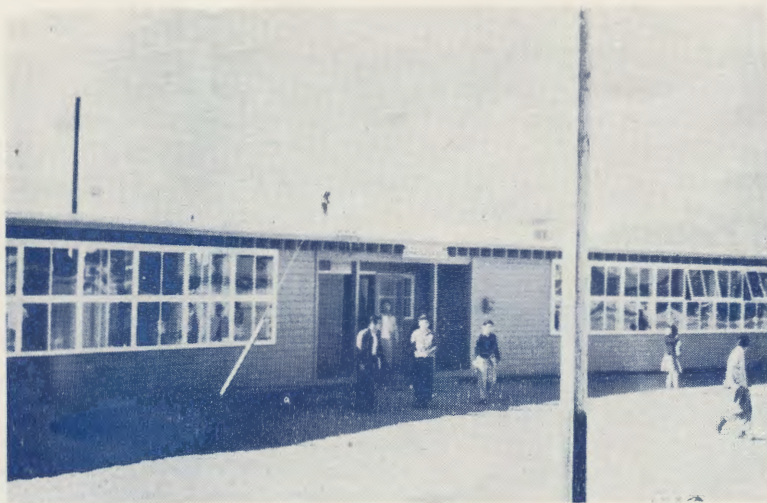

## SCHOOL HISTORY

On September 14, 1942, Tri-State High School opened its doors to 2400 students—not, as you would picture it, a big, beautiful school as were our former schools, but twenty tar-papered barracks, with benches to sit on and books to be shared, and crude, big, coal stoves to keep the students warm.

Slowly but surely the school spirit began to appear and the first dance, "School Daze Swing," was held on October 15. Student body and class officers were elected; Hello Day, weekly rallies, and inter-class track meets sponsored by the Boys' League brought the activities into full swing. Student activity cards and annual subscriptions were sold; a scholarship fund was raised. Student body officers were elected and installed for the next school term. Climaxing the year were the Junior Prom and the Senior Ball.

On the morning of February 2, 1944, a group of boys and girls strolled up the sandy yard of the new school building. Many new faces were to be seen in the hallways, and in the offices of the boys' and girls' counsellors as anxious students settled down to their studies.

Henry Inami was elected president of the student body, and other officers were chosen to form the Executive Committee. Activities go underway quickly with "Hello Day" on April 14 and the "Inaugural Ball" on April 15. June graduates enjoyed a full day away from studies on "Senior Sneak Day," June 2. The high point of the social events for the first semester was the Junior-Senior Ball held June 3. Parents got better acquainted with the school at Open House on June 7; also on June 9, at the talent show, entitled "Editor's Nightmare" in which much talent among students was revealed. To round off the first semester were the Baccalaureate Service, June 11, and Commencement, June 16.

Following a short vacation the second semester started off with the election of officers on August 4 to fill the vacancies in the Executive Committee. The "Campus Carnival" given August 18 and 19 for the purpose of raising money for the "Aquila" was one of the big events. Culminating the two-day affair was the crowning of the Campus Coed, Miyeko Ishikawa, at the Coed Ball.

As graduation day came closer for the November graduates, activities came to a peak with the Senior Banquet on October 21, the Junior Prom on November 18, Baccalaureate Services on November 19, and Commencement November 24.

Fatigued students left school rooms and corridors empty and quiet, only to fill them again after a brief vacation.



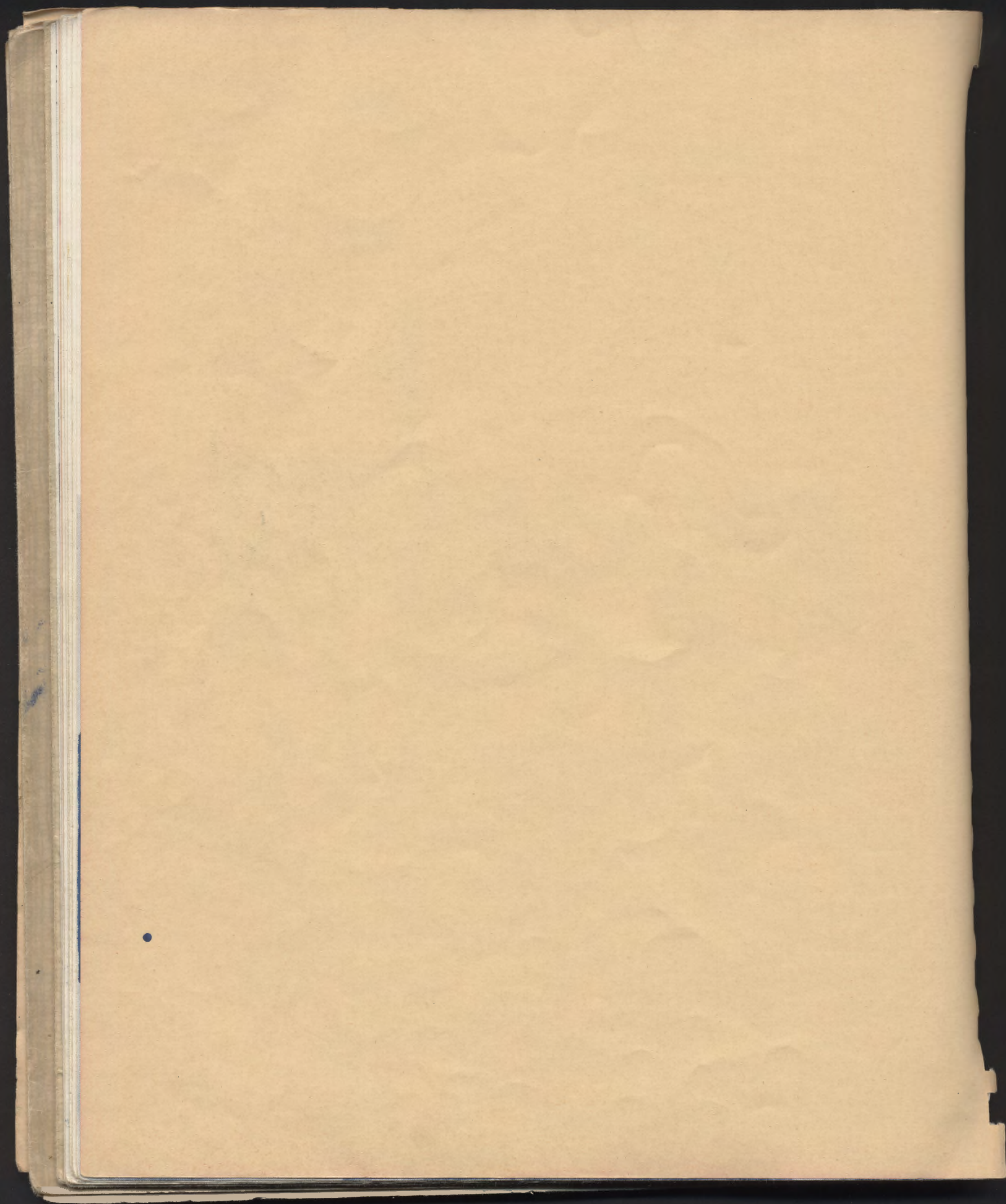

Gunderson and Miss Jeannette Higgins.

Two hundred and thirty-eight students completed their school year, with the Baccalaureate Service on June 11 and graduation on June 16.

Under the direction of the president, the senior class presented a bingo stand at the "Campus Carnival" held on July 1-2.

Another highlight of the class activities was the long-awaited senior banquet on October 21 at Cafe 720, decorated in Hawaiian atmosphere. A tempting dinner was served by girls from the junior class, while soft Hawaiian music was furnished by the "Paradise Melodiers."

Happy memorable days at Tri-State drew to a close for the seniors with the graduation exercises held on November 24.

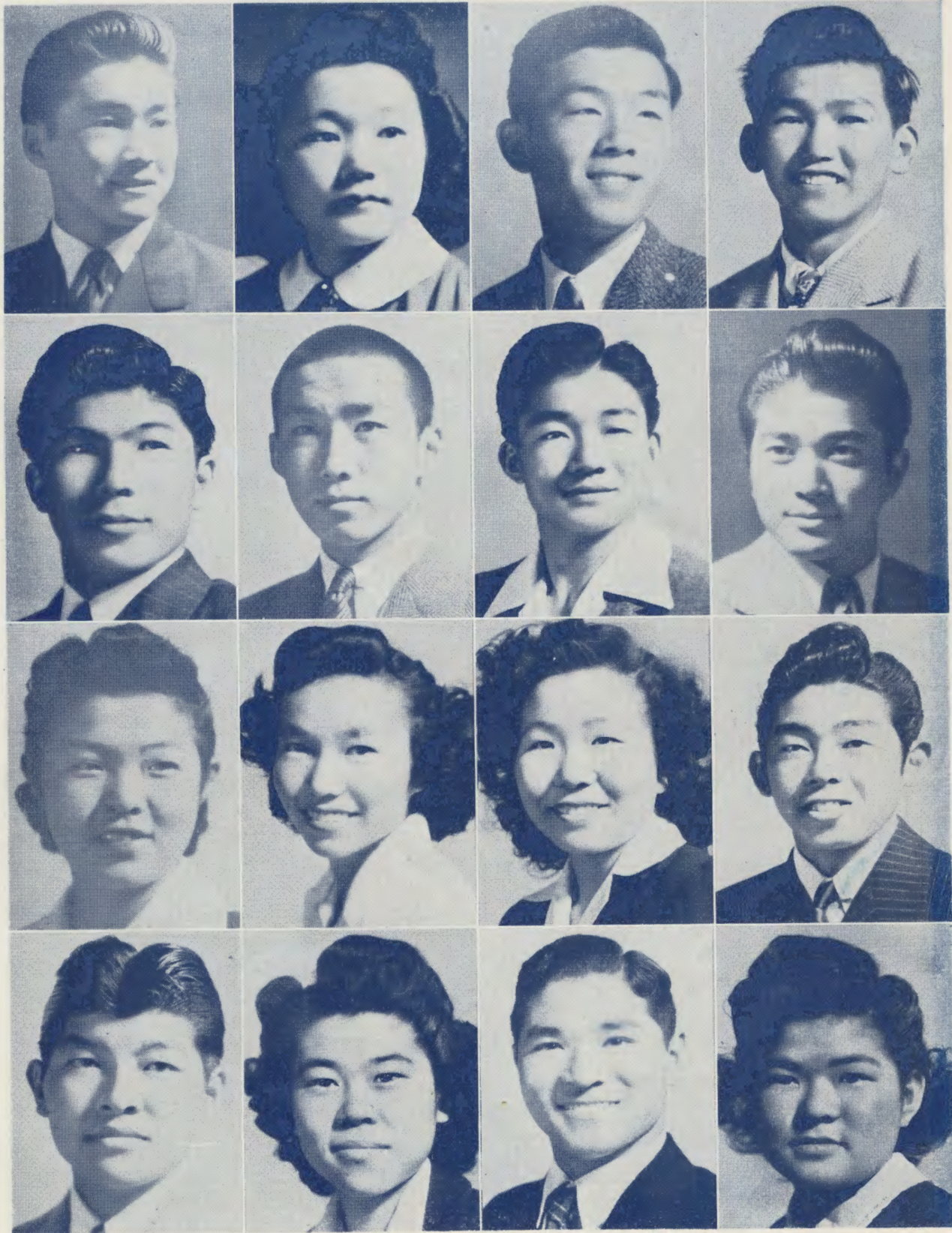

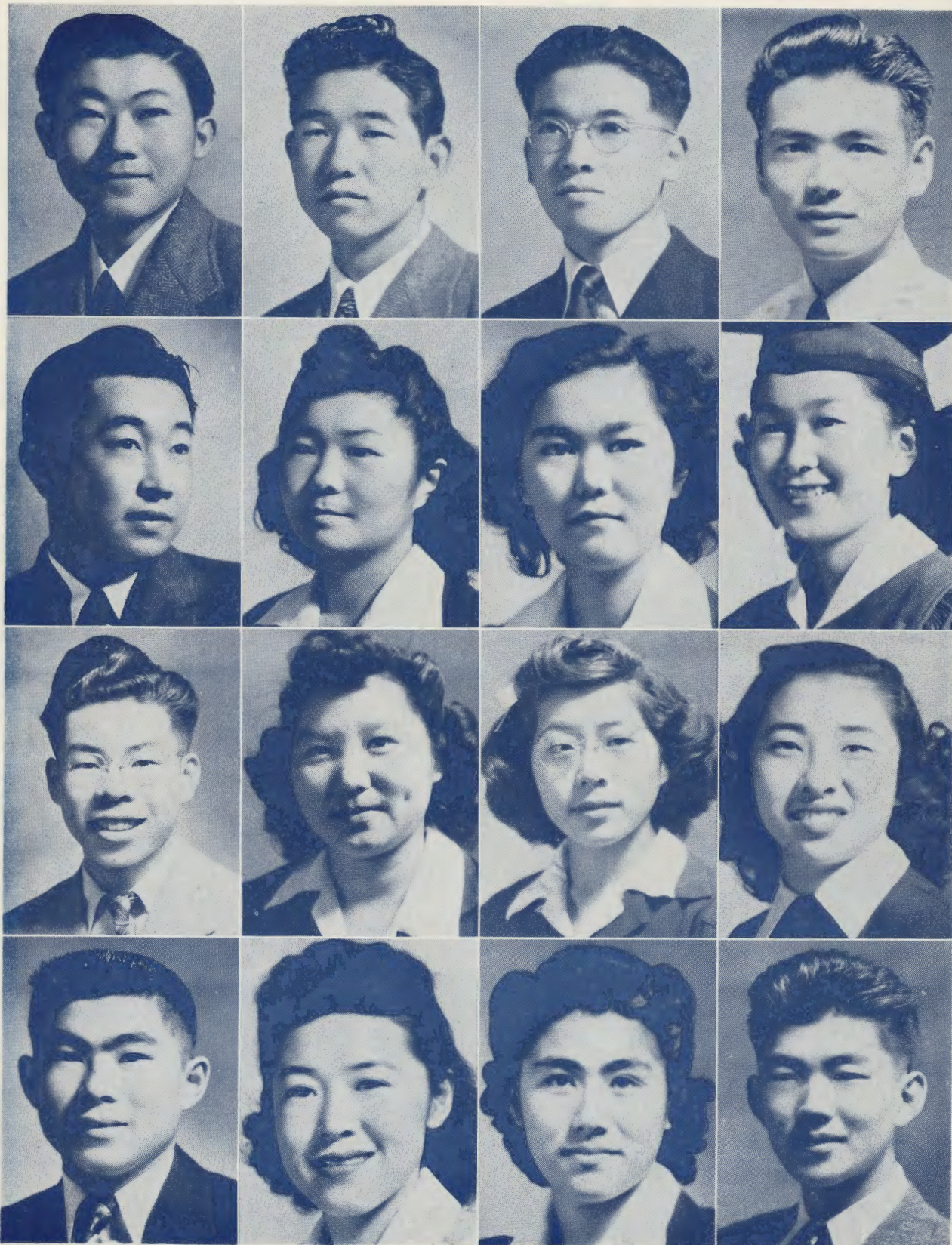

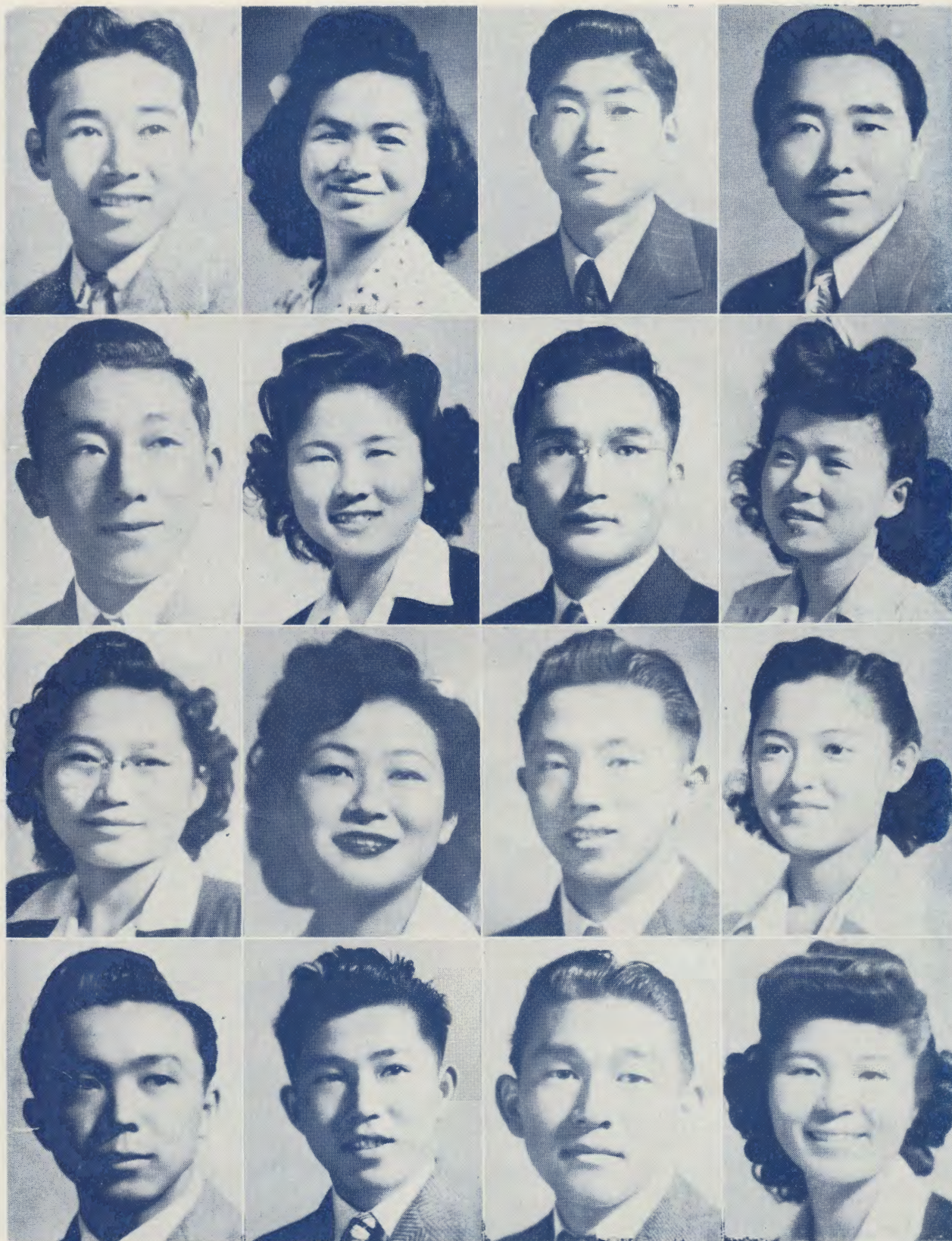
