

JOINT MEETING OF B.A.O. AND BLOVK CHAIRMEN 11:20 A.M.

15. B.A.O. members present.

Mr. Hayashida opened joint session with an introduction of purpose of the meeting to exchange opinions on question of disputation at Poston.

Mr. Koide made public of disputation existing at Poston:

1. Inefficient policing at County Fair: Open gambling under approval of the Council.
2. Issei meeting condemned all faults and maladjustments in connection with issei-nisei union were attributed to the Councilmen, all of whom are nisei.
3. Manifesto to Dillon Myer by the Community Council to give wider margin of issei participation so much as to admit issei for the office of the Community Council was rejected.

Mr. Nishizu modified Mr. Koide's report by adding that a Kibei group attacked and assaulted a possible informer, and a mob of 2000 claimed exoneration of said group.

Mr. Tomo advocated a gradual basis on which issei refrain from hasty recommendation of issei participation or of recognition or adopting of issei's rights in the new government.

Mr. Barber requested the Joint Committee to set up a census Committee to check up averaging individual cost of living per definite period of time to be presented to Washington D.C. as basic information in setting up a budget presumably for the fiscal year of 1943-1944.

He reported that the Administration is dissatisfied on Work Clothing Policy of W.R.A., however, the Administration is contemplating to make use of Public Grants for additional clothing for workers by making vouchers to take care of special categories of workers whose work gives additional wear and tear. There are two pictures to be put into consideration in carrying on additional work clothing distribution:

1. To meet knowledge of thinking is authority who has blocked additional issue of work clothing allowances as of Oct. 21.
2. Knowledge of legal limit in which we do not conflict with the W.R.A. regulations.

Work clothing turned over to workers prior to freezing thereof on Oct. 21, shall become their personal property.

Meeting adjourned at 12:00 P.M., with announcement of calling meeting with Mr. Barber and Clothing Committee to discuss additional distribution of work clothing.
