

MANZANAR (CIRCA 1944)

Classic today is the account of Issei and Nisei who left their peaceful communities for Relocation Centers so remote that they weren't even on the map. Manzanar was one these camps. Describe Manzanar as you will — and you're probably correct. Sand, wind, ice, heat and 36 blocks of tar-papered barracks. But when people came, they planted lawns, trees and shrubs. They dug holes and built ponds, rock gardens, waterfalls and wishing wells. They pooled their cultural resources and formed flower arrangement, shuji, and shigin classes and dozens more. Competition was fierce from baseball to gymnastics to judo. Educational system and its requirements were just as high as any other American school. Industry included garment and furniture production, and even tofu and miso manufacturing. Farmers transformed barren desert wasteland into productive farmland.

This was the cultural, industrial, and agricultural Manzanar and for a while, it was my home. I claim this former desert community for it is so much a part of me. I go there when I'm depressed or insecure or disgusted or perplexed — and I become well and confident again because I am reminded of those diligent. Issei and Nisei. With pride and determination, they faced that wartime episode as just another interlude in one's life . . . and ventured into totally unfamiliar and often hostile communities to start their lives from "ground zero".

Many of the Issei and Nisei have long passed away. To them, I would like to say, "Thank you for making this world a better place to live, and creating an environment where I can take pride in being a Nisei."

Perhaps, to some people, Manzanar may have been a "concentration camp" engulfed in hatred and prejudice. But for me, Manzanar will always remain a Monument of Peace & Serenity, depicting Japanese pride, honor, dignity, determination and courage.







Secondly we fondly cherish the friendship and leadership given to our struggle, our fellow Nisei, Marielle's Uncle Harold and Aunt Edith Ouchida, and all other hard-working Nisei relatives, family and friends who endured and continued courageously to show us how to live nobly.

Lastly, we dedicate this page in nostalgic affection for an unique community of Florin Area whose vitality and life vanished when the majority of its population, the 2500 people of Japanese Descent were abruptly uprooted by Executive Order 9066 in May 1942, at the peak of our strawberry harvest. 75 percent of us were American born citizens, yet we along with our aging Issei parents were incarcerated in ten Government holding pens along with 120,000 others of Japanese Ancestry living in Washington, Oregon, California and Arizona.

The story of Florin and all its courageous people's experiences are told in a new book, published a year ago, September 1987. "WETHEPEOPLE: A Story of Internment in America" is your story and Florin's history now a part of America's History, co-authored by Elizabeth Pinkerton and Mary Tsukamoto. (We have had great success. The first printing was sold out in 8 months.)

Florin suddenly is in the limelight of national news. At the prestigious Smithsonian, at the National Museum of American History you will see exhibited Florin's strawberry baskets, crates, bonnets, photos of familiar faces and artifacts made by Florin evacuees at Fresno and Jerome. Entitled, "A MORE PERFECT UNION: The Japanese Americans and the United States CONSTITUION. You must take your families in the next 5 years, to see and hear voices telling of our travail, ennobled by this extra-ordinary Smithsonian Exhibition.



Florin Area Recollections

In The Making

If historians won't someday review this booklet, many of our grandchildren certainly would, and probably become bewildered by the paradox of Florin's "golden age" which spanned over 50 years from late nineteenth century into the early 40's.

The Southern California Florin Area souvenir booklet was conceived during the summer of 1987 with co-chairmen Sam Nakano, Richard Ochiai and Jim Kawaguchi at the helm. The response was fabulous . . . the originally estimated 20-page booklet expanded to thirty, forty, . . . and soon it became a 70-page publication. Cedrick Shimo's literary reserve was tapped for newspaper and booklet articles. Hit Okanishi's publication experience was utilized for reprinting Sacramento Bee's informative articles by Linda Jones Beymer, "Internment wilted Florin", and Richard Abram's "Speak out or endure?" and "World War II internees still imprisoned by guilt"; plus Los Angeles Times staff writer Josh Getlin's article, "Redress: for reprinting these articles were graciously offered by The Sacramento Bee, Los Angeles Times, and The Rafu Shimpo. Photos were offered for publication by Walter Miyao, Elmer Uchida, the Nakanos and the Okanishis, Alice Inouye, James Abe, and many more. Mike Shintsubo and Buena Park Hotel offered the use of their meeting rooms and other services to the planning committee. . . . the list goes on and on.




