Mr. Nagano, acting Chairman in place of Mr. Hayashida

1. Establishment of Barber Shops and Shoe Repair Shop:  
Mr. Hayashida reported that Mr. Todd informed that barber shops will be established at 13-8 and B-22 in the laundry room and shoe repair shop at B-24-25 North Half.
2. Storage room for sewing Machines:  
Mr. Yokota proposed to request a storage room for residents' sewing machines in the laundry rooms by a partition. The proposal passed.
3. Community Stores:  
Mr. Ishikawa proposed to request a reduction of price of merchandises sold at the Community Stores. Proposal passed
4. Tour to Sawmill:  
Mr. Hartman reported the road to Sawmill being in good condition. Mr. Hartman cautioned to dress warmly, no plant to be cut or dug, and decided to gather at the Administration building at 9:00 A.M., Sunday, Nov. 22.
5. Agricultural Set-up:  
Mr. Nagamori proposed to set up a chicken farm. Mr. Hartman pointed out:
  1. No feeds: Has to be shipped in
  2. Should start baby chicks this spring
  3. Will raise chickens, hogs on new land; takes time on pastures.As to general plan of agricultural set up:
  1. Formation of the Agricultural Committee:
    - a. Two farmers recommended from each block
    - b. Invite local Japanese farmers for informations on local farming
  2. Formation of the Advisory Board:
    - a. Four members to be elected from the committee
    - b. Serves as advisors to Hartman and Ingram
    - c. Decides and sets up agricultural programs
    - d. Appoints a superintendent of each agricultural division such as poultry, dairy, various agricultural fields.
  3. Chairmen's Council to serve as a tie between the Committee and the City Council.
  4. Technicians to check alkali and nature of soil to determine informations pertaining to the extent of agricultural possibilities.
6. Problem of Founding Mortar:  
Mr. Mineta's question as to possibility of obtaining a log 28 inches in diameter, Mr. Hartman assured that such logs could be obtained by requisition after the sawmill starts operating.
7. Agricultural Committee of the Chairmen's Council:  
Messrs. Tsuneishi, Fujimoto, Kawahara, Oka, Gorai were duly appointed to deal with agricultural problems.

8. Mr. Gorai proposed to request Mr. Hartman to release on the Sentinel on selection of two farmer from each block to serve as Agricultural Committee members. Mr. Tsunakai proposed to request Mr. Hartman to announce on the Sentinel for 80 more additional canal workers, and requested the Block Chairmen to take it in consideration. Both proposals were approved by the Council which assigned the Council's Agricultural Committee for above purposes.

9. Photograph and Dry Cleaning Projects:

Mr. Fujioka proposed to request the establishment of a Photograph and a Dry Cleaning projects within the center under the supervision of the Community Enterprises. The proposal passed.
