1. Block Carpenter:

Mr. Oka proposed to assign two men to carpenter work in the block. Mr. Okada informed that carpenters' club will handle block carpentry through block foreman of each block carpenters.

2. Laundry for mess Workers' Aprons:

Mr. Fujimoto proposed to request supply of two washing machines ("Maytag") per block to launder mess workers' aprons, and also a selection of two laundresses per block.

The Proposal passed for an agendum.

3. Christmas Presents:

Mr. Fujioka pointed out that although it was agreed by block Chairmen to cancel all forms of exchange of presents and parties sponsored by the block, a few blocks have permitted the disregard of such restrictions, which would create undesirable feelings in other blocks. The Council ruled that block Chairmen advise their respective blocks to arrange accordingly in restricting any gay goings-on in consideration of our state of circumstances.

4. Red Cross Organization:

Mr. Tsunokai reported that anyone who is interested in Red Cross Organization report to 24-25 Social Welfare, Saturday, Dec. 19, at 1:30 P.M. An election of temporary Administrative officers will be held. It was also requested that as much as three or over are desirable from each block to form this organization.
