1. P.T.C.C. meetings:

Mr. Hayashida announced the date, time, and place of first general meeting of P.T.C.C.: as follows; 1:30--3:45 P.M., Monday, January 4, 1944, at Block 15-30.

2. Mr. Hayashida requested the Council, if any opinions or suggestions are formed, to discuss them at the morning session tomorrow, before attending the Coordinating Committee with SAC and Administration representatives in the afternoon.

3. Distribution of coupons:

Mr. Koide proposed to request the Administration as to the budget for distribution of coupons to all individuals such as was done at Assembly centers.

Later Mr. Barber explained that in relocation centers those individuals who are not on the pay rolls are entitled either to unemployment compensation or the public welfare grants. When asked by Mr. Koide as to the status of block Chairmen and others in regard to unemployment compensation, Mr. Barber said that he understood the eligibility and payment of the said compensation was effective as of October 1st instead of as November 1st as paid by Mr. Nelson. He (Mr. Barber) requested Mr. Todde follow through this case.

4. Promotion of Wage Class:

Mr. Koide brought up the question of raising cooks wages to "C" class from "B" class. The Council concluded that the committee of Mess Division tender official request to Mr. Robertson and Mr. Haller, copy of which be submitted to the Council.

5. Agenda, 12/18: Mr. Barber

1. According to cletype from Washington, the Administrative officials and staffs will have no day-off on the New Year's Day; however, Mr. Robertson is trying to get in touch with Mr. Smart to arrange day-off on 1/1/44 for evacuee employees by applying compensatory hours or work two Saturday afternoons to compensate for day-off on January 1st.
2. If #1 is approved, this question will be carried out as proposed.

6. Recreation:

Mr. Barber reported that 5 of recreation halls adjoining elementary schools will be cleared for children's recreation. One person will be charged to supervise on children's activities.

3 CCC buildings will be erected to provide for various activities which are moved out of recreation halls. Sub-post Offices will be closed so as to furnish room for the offices of SAC and Block Chairmen. SAC secretary will sell stamps, distribute parcel posts but as letters, central post office will deliver mails by means of carrier system, 1 carrier for each two blocks. One sub-post office will be provided for sorting letters.

Mr. Fujimoto reported the result of Recreation Conference yesterday that the 4th of January, 1943, was set for general meeting of all block recreation Committeemen to discuss plans and progress to be carried out throughout the calendar year of 1943.

7. Joint Session by the Judicial Body, SAC Block Chairmen:

Mr. Hayashida reported to the Council details of the Joint meeting.

8. Police Department:

Mr. Barber told the Council that by setting up qualifications, required number in the Police Dept. will be selected and put in the force.

9. Central Receiving Warehouses:

Mr. Koide requested that Mr. Todd announce the location of the Central Receiving warehouses on the west coast and that forms be released for applications.
