January 7, 1943 At Conference Room Thursday

Absentees: Messrs. Hayashida and Kaneko. Acting chairman: Mr. Nagumo

1. Case of Stabbing:

Mr. Barber reported that victim of stabbing was out of danger and presented the fact in regard to assailant in stabbing case that the County Attorney and the Sheriff took into consideration the fact that the assellant is an aggd man and that the defendant is very pathetic, remaining quiet at all times; therefore suggested that the defendant enter plea of guilty to simple assault so they would accept plea and give him a jail sentence in Cody, amount of sentence being up to 11 months but part of which could be suspended. In view of above fact Mr. Barber requested Block Chairmen to consider a selection of a responsible person to be an observer at the trall and serve as an interpreter.

2. Repretion of Court Faculty:

Mr. Nammo proposed to request Mr. Housel to maintain status-quo until the complete drafting of Charter is accomplished and acknowledged and take into consideration of the fact the court needs men of legal experience. The proposal passed.

3. Permit in Using Mess Halls:

Mr. Okazaki pointed out subtlety in obtaining permit for the use of mess halls. Mr. Koide recommended that such permit should be made to issue through the office of Block Chairman and Bl ck Administrator who makes arrangement with the accreation Department for the schedule and at the same time notify block residents and chef. The recommendation passed for agenda.

4. Community Hall:

Mr. Okagaki suggested for chairmen's consideration of constructing a school auditorium having a capacity of secommodating 5000 persons.

5. Utilization of waste froducts:

Mr. Mako, in behalf of boy and girl scouts, requested block Chairmen's assistance in conveying mess chefs. and workers to keep in good conditions the used egg boxes, bread boxes as such can be sold and the proceeds will be alloted to scouts' as well as children's recreation.

6. Rock Salt # + I ce= 7

Mr. Ishikawa (B-25) explained that salt will serve as a medium of melting ice and proposed to request supply of cheap grade salt to prevent danger of slipping in front of mess and laundry entrances. Passed.

7. Refu d on Catalog Order Commission:

Mr. Jehikawa (B-25) proposed to request Mr. *odd to report the decision of the conference with the Community Enterprise Advisory Board on the disposition of commission forwarded from Montgomery ward on catalog order placed through the Community Interprises. Passed.

8. 1943 Calandar:

Mr. Coral proposed to request distribution of a 1943 calendar to each upartment, either to be supplied by wards or Sears, Coebuck & Co. or to be printed in binding finish at a print shop. Passed.

9. Improvement of Apartments:

"r. Okazaki praposed to request furnishingapartment with a table and a chair (per person), a linoleum floor, etc. Passed.

10. Em rgency Fire Exit:

r. Nagamori proposed to push erection of an emergency fire exit in every apartment, originally proposed by the F ire Dept. Passed.

11. Dental Climicat

Mr. Matsushige proposed to request fursish free dental plates to needy residents by WRA. Proposel amended that Drs. Teragawa and Kawahara be called to the Tuesday meeting for detailed explanation on dental clinics.

12. Children's Attendants at Hospital:

Er. Gorai proposed to request permit on parents or kins attending infant patients at any time of day and night. Passed.

13. Apprehension:

The Founcil decided and concluded to request Administration to issue a written official statement as to the possibility of whether persons received public grants shall be doomed to a threat on the civic reights after the war.

14. Clothing Allowances:

Mr. -shikawa (B-25) proposed to distribute clothing allowances for October and November to all individuals as been done for July, August, and ceptember allowances.

Passed.
