1. Informal discussions on the result of block meetings of the previous night.
2. Liut. MacDaniel O. K. ed the change of "application" to "registration" but the suggestion by Mr. Miyasato of legal assistants to Mr. Housel was decided the best. Reservation to be inserted;
"The applicant upon filing this form, W.R.A. 126 revised, is not obligated to leave the W.R.A. center against his desire".
3. The registration form 126 to be translated into the Japanese for convenience and saving time.
4. Block 30 reported it is the best policy to have the meeting jointly and the aged to give advise to youth.
5. Block 12 reported that the residents agreed to sign only when the form is changed. Block 27 about the same opinion.

CONCLUSION:

6. One who has signed for repatriation will get only short term leave permit to complete business. The W.R.A. will pay his expence and will furnish an escort if necessary.
7. It has been stated before by Mr. Robertson that one more movement of evacuee with five hundred pound of freight free. Point to be cleared; 500# person or family.
8. The W.R.A. form 126 revised to be interpreted as "Shuusho ken kakutoku", Reference as "Chijin or San konin".
9. Discussion with Mr. Housel;
The W.R.A. form 126 revised with reservation inserted is acceptable legally.
Even though reservation on, if War Department or Government wills, we will be forced out. "You have been forced out of your own homes."
