Mr. Oka proposed to request the Administration for free gas ration book for Mr. Ujifusa of Worland, recommended advisor for Agricultural Committee to Mr. Hartman. Secretary to contact Mr. Nelson or Mr. Lane.

Among the chairmen of all block Young People's Organization at the meeting held at 22-26 Friday night. Messrs. P. Nakadate, Funabiki, and Mauri had been elected drafting committee of petition for clearance of nisei citizenship status to the White House. The drafted petition shall then be signed by all block residents next week.

Jerome Community Council chairman requested opinion or resolution passed regarding their registration by the Council of this center, reported Mr. Kaide, to which Council passed that Mr. Koide reply by letter stating procedures taken by this body and the course of events to date.

Mr. Nagamori proposed to provide paper towel and liquid soap in every latrine in order to maintain better sanitary conditions. Passed.

Mr. Gorai proposed to distribute a small scale in every mess kitchen. Passed.

Mr. Barber requested Council's approval on the quarterly report on the records of the Project to be submitted to Washington, drafted by Mr. Barber with the aids of Messrs. Hayashida and Koide. Council approved.

Appreciation for the services rendered was expressed particularly to Messrs. Koide, Nagumo, Nagata, and Hayashida by the fellow members of this Council.

Secretary Iwamoto expressed his desire to resign as of this date in conjunction with the termination of the present tenure of the Temporary Council of Block Chairmen.

Chairman Hayashida delivered a valediction in conclusion.
