

Reports from Committee

1. Eiichi Sakauye, Chairman of the Postal committee, requested the following blocks to turn in their Block Manager's office keys immediately to have duplicates made: #7, #9, #21, #24, and #27. He further stated that Mr. Inouye, supervisor of mails in the area, saw Mr. Main concerning two additional pigeon holes (24 hole) that are needed. Mr. Inouye was informed to ask the Block Managers to send a memorandum to Mr. Hill to have these two pigeon holes made, and also to have the other pigeon holes cut in two; the latter to be distributed to each Block Manager's office.

Eiichi Sakauye suggested that we try this new carrier system, and in the event that this does not prove successful, have a little space at the present sub-station, and the mail carriers operate from there and retain the five sub-station girls who will lose their jobs through this new system.

2. Mr. Kizu reported that since the building of porches comes under the WPB, it will be impossible to have it built.
3. Health and Sanitation committee Eiichi Sakauye saw Mrs. Tani regarding blood donations. He reported as follows:
 1. The blood will be typed first.
 2. There is no ill effect after donating blood. Within three days, blood donors will regain their health.
 3. Have blood donors in each block in case of emergencies in that blk.
 4. Blood donors will be picked up at the Block Manager's office by an ambulance; after completion, will be return to the same place.
 5. Suggested age limit is 19 yrs to 45 yrs.

Eiichi Sakauye was asked to see Mr. Wechau in having continuous publicity in this matter.

Old Business

1. Block Managers were requested to submit their Red Cross representatives as soon as possible.
2. Block directories for the post office are to be in by this week.
3. Managers were requested submit two or three names of the leaders in each block to work out an educational program in relocation so that this Center may get more of a spontaneous interest in relocation than right now.
4. A suggestion was made to educated the outside people first, as the Nisei are pretty well educated as to the reason why we are in this Center. The Chairman stated that these leaders should be informed and have it brought up at the relocation conference.

New Business

1. Community Activities will distribute second hand toys to the Community to be loaned to the people.

2. The Chairman reported that the WRA is not supplying the expense money for the relocation representatives to Chicago which is to be held sometime in latter part of January or the first of February. The Council wired Mr. Myers stressing the importance of relocation, and that the WRA should help defray the delegates expenses. He believes that the other Centers will follow suit in this matter. The following things will be proposed:
- a. Pertaining to transportation.
 - b. Evacuee property.
 - c. Provide pullman accommodation for relocatees.
 - d. Take away these strings from cash grants.
 - e. Increase the cash grant.
 - f. More cooperation from regional officers.

Under the present program, the minute a person leaves this Center to relocate, he is on his own. As long as the WRA has a regional officers it is the responsibility of these officers to look after the relocatees. The Chairman reported that Yosh Kodama is working as to having funds to take care of an evacuee in the event that person is out of funds and needs help.

3. Block 14 Manager asked whether or not the volunteer agriculture workers especially the students, were going to get their wages or not. Eiichi Sakauye will look into the matter.
4. Shig Sakaguchi, C. A. representative, was asked to make a report on the ping-pong tables.
5. Blocks without Managers were asked to get a Manager as soon as possible
